- D.68-1 On September 13, the CPUC and the Forest Service formally extended the public review period for the Draft EIR/EIS to October 3, 2006. Please see General Response GR-5 on noticing procedures and Draft EIR/EIS review period.
- D.68-2 Please see General Response GR-1 regarding potential effects on property values. The proposed Project and each of the alternative routes would result in impacts to a number of issue areas that include biological resources (Section C.3), public health and safety (Section C.6), and noise (Section C.10), which are discussed in the aforementioned sections of the Draft EIR/EIS.
