Generating Station (SONGS) Steam Generator Replacement Project

The California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) has released the Final Environmental Impact Report (EIR) under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) for consideration of Southern California Edison's (SCE) application (A.04-02-026) to replace the steam generators at San Onofre Nuclear Generating Station Units 2 and 3 (SONGS 2 & 3). The Final EIR incorporates changes resulting from comments submitted during the Draft EIR comment period (April 15 to May 31, 2005).

Description of the Proposed Project. This Proposed Project would enable SONGS to remain in service until the end of the current term of each of the Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) licenses. The current licenses authorize SONGS 2 & 3 to operate until 2022. However, the existing steam generators have exhibited degradation and are currently predicted to reach the end of their operating life within the next several years. The original steam generators will eventually reach a state where, under applicable NRC regulations, either the steam generators must be replaced or the units must be shut down.

Contents of the Final EIR. The Final EIR consists of two volumes and includes about 1,200 pages. Volume I (EIR) is completely re-printed from the Draft EIR. Changes made to the Draft EIR are marked in Volume I: inserted text is <u>underlined</u> and deleted text is shown in <u>strikeout</u>. Both types of changes are indicated with a vertical line in the margin. Volume II consists of all comments on the Draft EIR and responses to comments. Over 700 pages of comments on the Draft EIR were submitted to the CPUC.

CPUC Actions After Final EIR Publication. There is no comment period following issuance of the Final EIR. The CPUC will determine the adequacy of this Final EIR, and, if the EIR is found to be adequate, will certify the document as compliant with CEQA. The CPUC will issue a Decision on the Proposed Project, which will be announced and published concurrent with a scheduled CPUC Meeting. Parties to the General Proceeding (A.04-02-026) may apply for rehearing of a Decision within 30 days of the CPUC Meeting, unless otherwise specified. If the CPUC approves the project or an alternative, the CPUC will implement a Mitigation Monitoring, Reporting, and Compliance Program as defined in Section H of the EIR. This program will ensure that the approved project is implemented as designed, and that all adopted mitigation measures are implemented in order that effects on the environment do not exceed those defined in this EIR.

Availability of Final EIR. Copies of the Final EIR have been mailed to parties to the General Proceeding and to Federal, State, and local government agencies that commented on the Draft EIR, as well as members of the public. The document is available on the CPUC's project website at:
