Statement against the Sunrise Powerlink proposal.

I am not in favor of the Sunrise Powerlink project for many reasons and I would like to take this opportunity to state only a couple of those reasons.

The mission statement for the California State Parks system is a follows:

To provide for the health, inspiration and education of the people of California by helping to PERSERVE the state's extraordinary biological diversity, PROTECTING its most valued natural and cultural resources, and creating opportunities for high-quality outdoor recreation.
