The California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC), as Lead Agency under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), and the U.S. Department of the Interior, Bureau of Land Management (BLM) as Lead Agency under the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) have prepared a Draft Environmental Impact Report/Environmental Impact Statement (Draft EIR/EIS) and Proposed Land Use Plan Amendment for consideration of San Diego Gas & Electric Company's (SDG&E) application to build and operate the Sunrise Powerlink Transmission Line Project.

What is the Proposed Project? SDG&E proposes to construct a new 91-mile, 500 kilovolt (kV) electric transmission line from Imperial Valley Substation (in Imperial County, near the City of El Centro) to a new Central East Substation (in central San Diego County, southwest of the intersection of County Highways S22 and S2) and a new 59-mile 230 kV transmission line that includes both overhead and underground segments from the new Central East Substation to SDG&E's existing Peñasquitos Substation (in the City of San Diego).

What is included in the Draft EIR/EIS? The Draft EIR/EIS contains 7,500+ pages in six volumes (see attached Table 3 for the contents of each volume). It includes the analysis of Proposed Project effects, as well as the analysis of the following additional components that are not currently proposed by SDG&E:

- Future transmission lines (230 and 500 kV) that would serve the San Diego area from the Central East Substation (including the Cities and communities of Poway, Escondido, Rainbow), generally following State Highway 76 and County Highway 6
- Other projects, called "connected actions" that are likely to be built if the Sunrise Powerlink transmission line is constructed.

The Draft EIR/EIS describes the Proposed Project, evaluates and describes the potential environmental impacts associated with the construction and operation of SDG&E's Proposed Project, identifies those impacts that could be significant, and presents mitigation measures, which, if adopted by the CPUC, BLM, or other responsible agencies, could avoid or minimize these impacts. The Draft EIR/EIS also evaluates 27 alternatives to the Proposed Project, including the No Project/No Action Alternative, as required by CEQA and NEPA.

Impacts of the Proposed Project. The Proposed Project as a whole would have 50 significant unmitigable impacts in one or more of the following issue areas: biological resources, visual resources, wilderness and recreation, agricultural resources, cultural resources, noise, air

quality, socioeconomics, public services and utilities, and fire and fuels management. Additionally, there would be a number of significant impacts that can be mitigated to a level that is less than significant, and other impacts that are adverse but would not require mitigation.

Availability of the Draft EIR/EIS. The Draft EIR/EIS will be released for public review on January 4, 2008. It will be available for review at numerous area libraries and on the project website, as listed in this notice. Additional copies of the Executive Summary of the Draft EIR/EIS along with a DVD of the complete document may be requested. The CPUC and BLM also have a limited number of copies of the complete Draft EIR/EIS document available to the public. Submitting Comments on the Draft EIR/EIS. Written comments on the Draft EIR/EIS must be postmarked or received by fax or e-mail no later than **April 11, 2008**. Please be sure to include your name, address, and telephone number. Written comments on the Draft EIR/EIS should be sent to:

Informational Workshops. In order to help affected communities understand the Proposed Project and the Draft EIR/EIS, and to explain how the public can participate in the CPUC and BLM's decision-making processes, the CPUC and BLM will hold 9 informational workshops during the week of January 28, 2008. These informal workshops are an opportunity to speak with the agency staff and the specialists who wrote the Draft EIR/EIS and ask questions; they will be available at the workshop times listed in the attached table. At the start of each workshop, a brief presentation will summarize the EIR/EIS process, the alternatives evaluated, the conclusions of the Draft EIR/EIS, and the decision-making process. Presentation notes will be available during all workshops, so attendance at the beginning of the workshop is not required. While written comments may be submitted during these workshops, there will be no facilities to record oral comments.

Public Participation Hearings. Three Public Participation Hearings will be held on the dates listed in the attached table to receive oral and written comments from interested parties. CPUC Administrative Law Judge Steven Weissman will conduct the Public Participation Hearings, and receive comments on the Draft EIR/EIS and any other issues of concern related to the SDG&E application. These oral comments will be recorded and entered into the public record.
