

EPA'S RESPONSIBILITIES

- 1. Serve as a clearinghouse for technical information on successful strategies for reducing SF₆ emissions;
- 2. Sponsor research relating to such strategies;
- 3. Conduct technical conferences;
- Provide a standard protocol to inventory, track, and report estimated SF₆ emissions;
- 8. Identify a Service Representative responsible for assisting the Partner in Implementing the Program; and
- Provide pariner recognition for achievements through brochures, public service announcements (PSAs), articles, and awards.

PARTNER'S RESPONSIBILITIES

- Establish a base year from which to begin estimating and reporting SF₆ emissions. The base year may be the year in which the MOU is signed or up to two years prior;
- Submit a report each year on system-wide emissions of SF₆ and describe technologies and practices implemented to reduce emissions;
- Develop and distribute a company-wide policy for the proper handling of SF₆ within one year of joining the program;
- Establish an SF₆ emissions reduction goal, after careful consideration of all technically and economically feasible options available; and
- Communicate to employees and cooperate with EPA efforts to publicize the Partnership.
