I. REPRESENTATIVES, LOCATIONS AND DATES

Frank Salazar, Campo Band of Mission Indians, served as the representative for the Rough Acres Substation, Link 1; October 18-22, 2010.

II. CONSTRUCTION ACTIVITIES

Activities included work near the guard shack, along Phase #1 Roads, signage installation along this segment, and erosion control maintenance.

III. OBSERVATIONS

October 18, 2010- Monday

Efforts today consisted of monitoring erosion control near Marina. Mr. Salazar found a single flake tool on the south side of the bungalows. A field inspection in the immediate area yielded no associated cultural materials.

October 19, 2010, Tuesday, NO WORK

October 20, 2010, Wednesday

Work consisted of monitoring installation of signage along Phase #1 Roads. No cultural material unearthed or found.

October 21, Thursday

Today work was scheduled at the Marina erosion control area. On call for work.

October 22, Friday

Efforts today centered on the Marina erosion control area and along a small seasonal waterway. Two small black metavolcanic isolated flakes found in waterway but no associated cultural materials.

IV. CONCERNS EXPRESSED

Mr. Salazar reported no concerns at this time.

V. SUMMARY

Other than the isolated stone debris noted above, no significant cultural resources were observed.
