**I. REPRESENTATIVES, LOCATIONS AND DATES**

Clarence Brown of the Viejas Tribe served as the Tribal representative to monitor construction efforts at the Alpine Underground on Link 4 from December 13-17, 2010. Mr. Kenny Stokes of the Campo Band of Mission Indians served as Native American monitor for the Suncrest Substation construction efforts on Link 3 for December 17 and 18, 2010.

**II. CONSTRUCTION ACTIVITIES**

Construction activity consisted of potholing and trenching on Link 4 and the grading for an access road on Link 3.

**III. OBSERVATIONS**

Many of the locations monitored had already been disturbed and consisted of digging in fill soils. No cultural material was noted at any of the locations.

Mr. Stokes noted that on the Suncrest Substation access road, one resource is within the project boundaries, according to a report he saw while on site. However, he did not see the site himself but mentions bedrock milling features and a lithic assemblage as having been a part of the site mentioned, according to the report.

**IV. CONCERNS EXPRESSED**

Mr. Brown expressed concern that additional monitors should be on the project; more specifically, at his substation.

Mr. Stokes calls to attention that the site discussed may be impacted due to construction efforts.

**V. SUMMARY**

Mr. Brown would like to see additional monitors participate on the substation and Mr. Stokes expressed concern for a site that may potentially be impacted by the access road being constructed.
