



Native American Representative Summary Report

Week 11: December 25 – January 2, 2010-2011

January 3, 2011

I. REPRESENTATIVES, LOCATIONS AND DATES

Four Native American Monitors submitted reports for the week of December 23 through December 31.

Clarence Brown of the Viejas Tribe served as the Tribal representative to monitor construction efforts along Alpine Boulevard.

Daniel Mason of the Campo Tribe Monitored sections along Link 3 on December 23.

Frank Salazar of the Campo Band of Mission Indians Monitored construction along the Rough Acres segment on December 30.

Jesse L Pinto of the Jamul Tribe provided additional construction monitoring.

II. CONSTRUCTION ACTIVITIES

Various construction activities were monitored during this period including marking off of environmentally sensitive areas, attending a pre-construction meeting, road grading and preparation of a staging site, potholing, track drilling, and backhoe excavations.

III. OBSERVATIONS

No cultural resources identified during this effort.

IV. CONCERNS EXPRESSED

One Monitor expressed that because of distance he could not monitor two areas at once. Another commented that the dozer operator was very precise when working near a cultural resource.
