## **I. REPRESENTATIVES, LOCATIONS AND DATES**

Link 1- Mr. Frank Salazar of the Campo Band of Mission Indians and Mr. Kenny Stokes, La Posta Band, monitored construction along the Rough Acres Segment for the week. Mr. Stokes monitored solely on January 21<sup>st</sup>.

Link 3 - Mr. Jesse Pinto of the Jamul Tribe provided additional construction monitoring along the Suncrest substation. Mr. Pinto's reports have yet to be submitted, an augment to this report will be submitted upon receiving those reports.

Link 4 - Mr. Clarence Brown and Mr. Frank Brown of the Viejas Tribe, and Mr. David Elliott Jr., Kumeyaay descendant, served as monitors along Link 4, at the Alpine substation\*.

## **II. CONSTRUCTION ACTIVITIES**

Various construction activities were monitored during this period including mowing, wattling, digging, brush removal, and installation of orange and black markers.

## **III. OBSERVATIONS**

Link 1 – Mr. Salazar reported only a single lithic for the week. Mr. Stokes did not observe any cultural resources at this time.

Link 3 – Awaiting submittal of reports.

Link 4 – Mr. C. Brown, Mr. F. Brown and Mr. Elliott did not observe any cultural resources at this time.

## **IV. CONCERNS EXPRESSED**

Mr. C. Brown did not appreciate a remark made by someone on the jobsite about possible human remains.

Mr. Elliott was concerned (1/18 and 1/19) about the quantity of monitors on the Link to monitor all ground disturbing activities. Additionally he is concerned that none of the Native American monitors were told of some ground disturbing activities and thus those areas weren't monitored. Mr. Elliott's concerns were rectified a couple days later (1/20) and he notes this on the report.

Ms. Dayle Cheever's response to Mr. Elliott's concerns, dated 1/25/11:

I would like to clarify two things in the notes from Dave Elliott. The requests that were made regarding more NA monitors were not ignored. The request was addressed and Burns and McDonnell was directed to ensure that there was a Native American monitor assigned each time an archaeological monitor was needed at the designated areas of concern along Link 4. The request by the NA representatives that areas outside the designated areas of concern along Link 4 should be covered by NA representatives was brought to my attention by Clarence Brown in a phone call after he discussed this with others including Susan Goldberg who represents the cultural resource interests of the CPUC. Susan explained to Mr. Brown why there are specific areas along Alpine Blvd. where monitors have been assigned and other areas where coverage is not

required. Mr. Brown called me on Jan. 20, 2011 and I explained the process that was used to determine where monitors were required. He explained his concerns and I said I would approve NA representatives in the areas of Link 4 where it was determined there was not an archaeological concern. I said there may not be an archaeological monitor with the NA representative in these areas but if they found something that needed assessment an archaeological monitor could be called in. I also explained that all cultural resource and Native American monitoring along Link 4 was intended to look at disturbance of previously undisturbed soil and not observation of the installation of vaults, conductor, backfilling or repair of the road after the fact. Daily field notes must be taken and submitted.

No other concerns were reported by the other monitors.
