Our home + property is valued in the high 700's. Edison's proposed would most definitely result in a great equity loss. Our home is in a high fire area. We now understand that the fire dept. "will not" fight near these lines. Fire risks ^{is} are greater than other alternatives + will result in the greatest demand for fire protection. More homes + property would be at risk in the event of a wildland fire. The fire dept fights our fires mostly by air, which would be impossible to navigate around these 200+ towers. Response to Comment Set D.95: Al and Robin Gregg

- D.95-1 As discussed in Draft EIR/EIS Section C.15.10.2, the change to existing views as a result of infrastructure construction are considered a significant and unavoidable impact of Alternative.5. Your concerns will be shared with the decision-makers who are reviewing the Project and alternatives at the USDA Forest Service and the CPUC.
- D.95-2 Please see General Response GR-3 regarding potential EMF health impacts.
- D.95-3 Please see General Response GR-1 regarding potential effects on property values.
- D.95-4 We recognize that Alternative 5 would constrain the ability to aggressively fight a wildland fire in the vicinity of the route, and would create additional fire risks to inhabited areas such as Leona Valley and Agua Dulce (see discussion in Section D.5). Your concerns will be shared with the decision-makers who are reviewing the Project and alternatives at the USDA Forest Service and the CPUC.
