II. **CONSTRUCTION ACTIVITIES**

At the beginning of the week, March 14, Mr. Pinto reports pending movement of rocks, and the next day, noted that would probably be delayed until the following week. By the 19th he reported rain over the coming weekend which probably would delay the rock moving further.

LINK 4: Alpine Underground Substation; Alpine Boulevard; Alpine Bullpen

Mr. D. Elliott expresses concern that more work trucks are needed. He also expresses that a Native American monitor should be present at the bullpen at all times.

Mr. Elliott's request for more trucks is noted and has been conveyed to the person who authorizes the work trucks. Additionally, his request to have a Native American monitor at the bullpen on a daily basis is already in effect.
