Week 4: November 1 – 5, 2010

November 8, 2010

I. REPRESENTATIVES, LOCATIONS AND DATES

Frank Salazar, Campo Band of Mission Indians, served as the Tribal representative to monitor construction at the Rough Acres Substation, Link 1, November 1 - 5, 2010.

II. CONSTRUCTION ACTIVITIES

Construction activity consisted of surveying prior to construction and monitoring the staking of ESA areas.

III. OBSERVATIONS

Reports for this week were submitted for only two days, Wednesday, November 3, and Friday, November 5. Representing a previously reported site around Tower 221a, Mr. Salazar found "some" green metavolcanic flakes, the quantity was not specified. Also representing a previously reported site around Tower 221-2, Mr. Salazar noted granite groundstone fragments and a piece of brownware (pottery). No further materials were noted in either previously recorded area. Continuing work around Area 185, Mr. Salazar found one small quartz flake and one small (fine grained) green metavolcanic flake. No other associated material was noted or reported.

Mr. Salazar reportedly worked on Thursday, November 4 for preconstruction monitoring. After consultation with Mr. Salazar via telephone on Monday, November 8th, Mr. Salazar mentioned that he had identified a chert flake during this preconstruction effort. Mr. Brian Williams, ASM Affiliates, reported that no monitor report was submitted to him for this day. Mr. Salazar mentioned that he would verify whether or not he had completed a monitor report for November 4th, despite no construction activity, and forward it to me by close of the business day Monday, November 8th. In which case, I will submit an addendum to this summary report. If no addendum is submitted, it can be assumed that no monitor report was completed for Thursday, November 4th's preconstruction activity.

IV. CONCERNS EXPRESSED

Mr. Salazar reported no concerns at this time.

Other than the findings above, no significant resources were observed.
