II. CONSTRUCTION ACTIVITIES

III. OBSERVATIONS

LINK 1: Jacumba Valley, McCain Valley, Boulevard, Plaster City, and Ocotillo Desert Region On September 23, Mr. Elliott noted 4 pottery sherds and a GMV flake. They were collected.

On September 21, Ms. Najera noted a lithic flake, which was collected. On September 22 Ms. Najera also noted a lithic core.

On September 19, Mr. Padilla noted two lithic cores, red silt stone, lithic flakes and a lithic tool. On September 22, Mr. Padilla also observed a mano.

On September 20, Mr. Salazar noted low density ceramics, moderate density lithics and high density groundstone. On September 21, Mr. Salazar noted moderate density lithics, light density ceramics and moderate density groundstone, as well as several unidentified, small burned bone fragments. On September 22, Mr. Salazar noted low to medium density ceramics, low to medium density groundstone, moderate density lithics and possible burned – possible human remains. Burned pectin shell was also present at the site. On September 23, Mr. Salazar noted "lithics, ceramics and groundstone. Heavy density lithics. Light density ceramics, medium density groundstone."

On September 22, Mr. Santos noted several lithic flakes, which were moved to the ESA and one lithic core, which was GPS'd and collected.
