Dear Ms. Reynolds:

On June 20, 2017, San Diego Gas & Electric (SDG&E) submitted Minor Project Refinement Request (MPRR) #6 to the California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC), requesting the following project refinement associated with Transmission Line (TL) 625B to complete the previously approved access road realignment at Pole Z272867:

- installation of a permanent drainage structure, including an approximately two-foot-wide and 160-foot-long concrete swale that will be installed approximately one foot deep, a 24-inch high-density polyethylene pipe (HDPE) pipe, and a rip-rap energy dissipation device, along the access road realignment; and
- additional temporary workspace to facilitate installation of the drainage structure.

Installation of the drainage structure would occur primarily within the existing temporary workspace approved in MPRR #2. However, additional temporary workspace will be required north and south of the existing access road to install the drainage structure, as described in the MPRR.

The CPUC voted on May 26, 2016 to approve the Cleveland National Forest Power Line Replacement Projects (Decision 16-05-038) and a Notice of Determination was submitted to the State Clearinghouse (SCH#2013091070).

The Commission decision approving the Permit to Construct (PTC) authorizes Energy Division staff to approve requests by SDG&E for minor project refinements. The decision states that minor project refinements that may be necessary due to final engineering of the project may be approved so long as such minor project refinements are located within the geographic boundary of the study area of the Environmental Impact Report/Environmental Impact Statement (EIR/EIS) and do not, without mitigation, result in a new significant impact or a substantial increase in the severity of a previously identified significant impact based on the criteria used in the EIR/EIS; conflict with any mitigation measure or applicable law or policy; or trigger an additional permit requirement.
