Although there will be increases in construction time, traffic impact, blasting, and trenching, these temporary inconveniences would provide a permanent end result of an entire underground system.

In addition to the crackling noises of overhead wires, there has been evidence of health risks and hazards as well as other hazards and issues where there has been overhead electrical wiring .

Many of us moved to this beautiful area for its beauty and its natural views which provide a quality of life unattainable in many other areas and which we would like to continue to enjoy. Also the natural beauty of the area attracts new home buyers and visitors which is vital to our local economy and growth. Dear CPUC Project Manager,

Thank you for the opportunity to comment on the Draft Environmental Impact Report for the Ivyglen Subtransmission Line Project. Members of the Board of Directors of the Glen Eden Corporation have reviewed the Draft EIR before the California Public Utilities Commission. As stated in our letter regarding the Notice of Preparation for this project in June 2015, we continue to have significant concerns about the adverse impacts the project would impose upon Glen Eden Sun Club, particularly along the boundary of our property on De Palma Road between Indian Truck Trail and Horsethief Canyon Road.

The project calls for reducing the span of the power poles currently along De Palma from an average of 200 feet to 80 feet and increasing the maximum pole height by as much as 80 feet. The anticipated impact would create significant visual intrusion and blight conditions along De Palma Road. This is a semi-rural area that would be devastated by the construction of the proposed above-ground utility structures along our property line.

We requested in our letter from June 2015 that the EIR consider the alternative of undergrounding the subtransmission line along De Palma Road between Indian Truck Trail and Horsethief Canyon Road. While there is no such alternative considered in the Draft EIR, the review does contain Alternative M, which would underground the new lines along the entire stretch of the project. This fails to address that there may be some areas where above-ground installation would be appropriate and instead creates an all-or-nothing alternative which may check a box for academic analysis but is worthless from a practical standpoint.

Glen Eden Corporation respectfully renews our request that the CPUC consider undergrounding that segment of the project along our property boundary where the impact is greatest on our well-established neighborhood, which deserves protection from being trapped behind a tightly packed row of concrete spears and wires.

As a residential neighborhood that has been in business for 50 years and whose residents are intimately familiar with the area, we strongly believe that the aesthetic and environmental conditions resulting from this project would have a significant, lasting and detrimental impact on our property and our residents and guests. As we stated in our June 2015 letter, the existing power poles directly in front of Glen Eden stand well underneath the tree line, where they are visually obscured by foliage. Installing the proposed structures over the two years that construction is contemplated would be a jarring, harmful and ultimately unnecessary intrusion onto the peaceful enjoyment of our property when a practical alternative exists that was ignored in the Draft EIR.


It is worth repeating our requests from June 2015 since they were not incorporated into the Draft EIR:

- Underground the portion of the project (added Segment 7) from Horsethief Canyon Road along the length of De Palma Road.
- Relocate the proposed guard structure from the corner of De Palma Road and Glen Eden Road elsewhere to an unpopulated location along De Palma or to the other side of Interstate 15 along Temescal Canyon Road, not in front of a residential neighborhood.
- Relocate helicopter use during construction to avoid the area of Glen Eden Sun Club.

We will continue to monitor the project as it moves through other stages of the process. We urge the CPUC to consider the viable alternative of partial undergrounding just along Segment 7 of the project in front of Glen Eden property because of the adverse and cumulative impacts on our existing residential community.

Please assure that Glen Eden Sun Club is included on all communications regarding EIR and associated reports for this project.

To the members of the California Public Utilities Commission:

As a resident of the Lake Elsinore Valley for more than half a century, I feel I must write in opposition to upcoming Valley-Ivyglen Alberhill Substation slated for the I-15 and Temescal Canyon Road that will be considered for construction. I have spoken to the local SCE representative, Jeremy Goldman, briefly on June 9, 2016, at a meeting of the Elsinore Woman's Club regarding some of my concerns.

I have read through the EIR and see again and again the impact levels for several specific items as being "less than significant" or creating little or no impact. Looking at the photographs provided regarding the towers size and locations, (pg.57) the area proposed would create serious risk for drivers along the I-15 and State Highway 74 as well. We know that a major earthquake will come, we simply don't know when and should it be of substantial size, such towers have the likelihood of falling or leaning over two roadways, I-15 and Highway 74, that could impede or prevent emergency services for local residents.

Lake Elsinore has two distinct and extremely busy intersections: one is at Railroad Canyon and Diamond Drive; the other is at Collier and Central. The volume of traffic both these intersections carry is unbelievably heavy during regular daily commute hours. The photographs taken do not realistically show what goes on seven days a week at those corners. Should a natural disaster happen and either of these intersections be impaired, chaos would ensue.

Our area has already been informed that in case of a major disaster, we will be "on our own for a minimum of three days," and to be adequately prepared with food, water supplies, emergency First Aid, etc. , and if power lines align with two major arteries of access, we may be the last on the list because of inaccessibility.

Mr. Goldman assured me that the huge metal giants can withstand almost anything. I hope he is prepared to put that statement to a real test where Mother Nature is concerned. We have had several small temblors and putting towers alongside a wash area does not make good sense to me. The study in 4.1.1.1 on visual characteristics and quality of landscape will certainly be diminished. Claiming that the regular power poles already in the area are "common elements in the landscape" takes no note of the

size of the towers. In 4.1.1.4 on scenic vistas the current traffic load may indeed not enjoy looking at the hillsides as they hurry to and from work, but many of us do object to huge humming lines and poles everywhere we choose to look.

I do not know the actual distance from Earl Warren Elementary School , Temescal Canyon High School, and Elsinore High School where these lines will be placed; but as a former school trustee, the line from 4.11.1 dealing with noise levels acknowledges it can and will effect schools. Students are, of course, sensitive receptors, and I have to wonder how outdoor physical education classes and other outdoor activities at these three school sites will be impacted. The study points out that on p. 4-11-27 the impact of NV-4 (VIG) of noise levels is both significant and unavoidable (table 4.11-15).

My family was here in 1979-80 when the massive flood cut our community in half and did in excess of \$9 million in damage and displaced several thousand families. The study refers to the lake as a 6,000 acre foot location approximately one mile south of lines ASP2 and VIG4 (see 4.9.13) I can tell you from first hand knowledge that the lake in the 1979 flood rose 17 vertical feet and spilled out the outflow channel without pumping. The outflow channel for the lake and flood water to exit should another flood like that occur are in line with the towers position on the left side of I-15N. I experienced that massive flood and helped as a coordinator with FEMA in an effort to assist the many families and property owners that needed help. We turned the Elsinore Woman's Club into a disaster center for several ongoing months and none of us volunteers were prepared well enough to handle what was thrown at us.

I know about liquefaction because of the small fault lines we already know are about the lake and are part of the Elsinore-Whittier fault line system. Why would anyone knowingly put others at risk by positioning towers when lines could be trenched and put underground.

Lastly, and perhaps on a more personal note, should a line snap or spark a fire, the areas of the 27 miles stretch are all dry and tinder box ready. I live in the exact crosshairs of both I-15 and Highway 74. It has been a long time since we have had a bad fire, but conditions are ripe with the ongoing drought condition.

I am not against progress; I am against placing a community at risk in order to save money, because I am certain the profit bottom line is a major factor in why the towers are necessary versus underground connections. If this were in Orange County, or even in the better areas of Los Angeles County, there would be a massive outcry against towers and a ground swell for underground containment.

I see the developments growing in the Temescal Valley area that need electrical power; I see the plans on the boards for some 8,000 more house in our vicinity. I understand the principal of change as the constant in all of life. But public safety is the primary reason for local government to exist. Without fire, police and emergency personnel, ordinary citizens are, in times of natural disaster, told to be properly prepared. When those entrusted to protect the small and the voiceless masses look away from that sacred duty in favor of doing something quickly, rather than doing the job correctly the first time, they will have to answer later for failure to protect and serve.


None of you live in our area; come down and SEE the visual and geological aspects that will be impacted by this project. I personally would be happy to host anyone from the commission and take them about to see first-hand how these lines will compromise the quality of our lives. My husband and I would be at your disposal should anyone wish to come.

I, too, know the meaning of public service. I have spent more than 48 years as an advocate and elected member of our community in various capacities. But I speak now as just one of the citizens who want to see our city and its surroundings given proper consideration in this need to improve the electricity grid. Surely, the cost for doing this underground cannot be that much considering those costs will ultimately will be passed on to ALL the ratepayers, both new and old.

I am enclosing one of the area maps with a mark as to where I live (approximately).

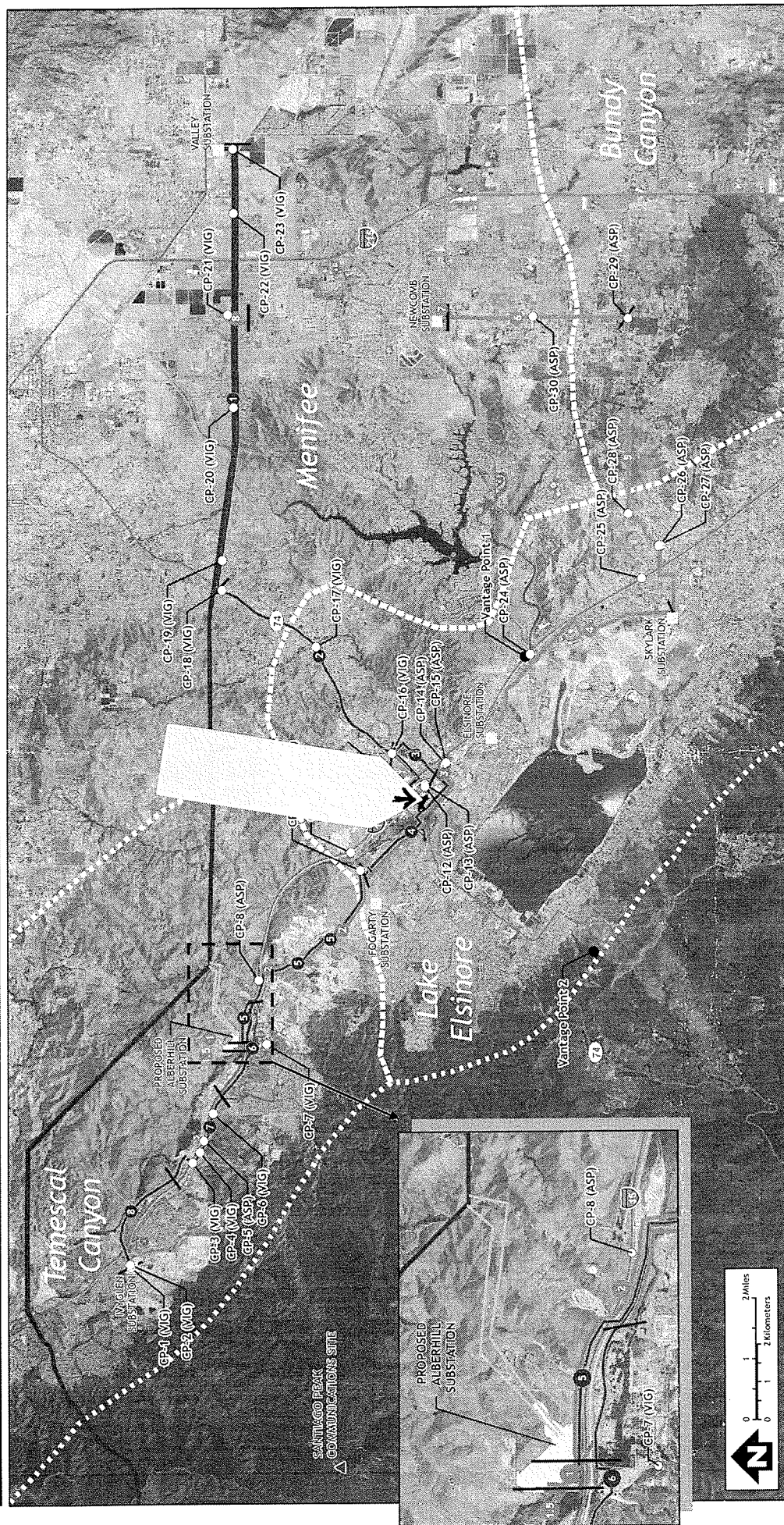

Since 1987 we have been members and siteholders at Glen Eden, located at 25999 Glen Eden Road, off De Palma Road between the Sycamore Creek and Horsethief Canyon developments.

We have recently been informed of the above-mentioned project and the fact that Edison plans to replace the existing wood utility poles with a row of 115' metal utility poles at 80' intervals along DePalma Road, directly in front of Glen Eden property. While we are not against the need to upgrade utilities for residents of this community and beyond, we believe that such projects should take into account the visual and consequential economic impact to residents and local communities. The purpose of this letter is to **request that the CPUC and SCE Edison reconsiders alternative routing and/or construction methods for De Palma Road** as detailed in the CPUC Draft EIR, dated April 2016, Section 3.0 which details alternatives under consideration. Specifically, **we request that the utilities along De Palma Road are either placed underground or relocated** so that they are less visible to residents or from the 15 freeway.

Our concerns include the following:

Aesthetics: The entire valley, its residents and visitors would be adversely affected by this extensive, intrusive construction. The new poles will rise significantly above the tree line. The SCE website states "...our goal is to site our lines in the least objectionable and intrusive way possible while ensuring reliable electricity for all our customers" - so why isn't this being done here?

Value of our Property: Glen Eden is owned by a member cooperative. We have 1,600+ members, 300+ corporate members, 100+ full-time residents and 100+ part-time residents. Members would see the value of their property decline if these poles are constructed directly in front.

Fiscal impact on our Business: Glen Eden is a business. We rely on continual marketing efforts to attract new members and retain membership. If the front, and first impression, of our property is permanently scarred by this installation, it will seriously impact our ability to attract and retain members, resulting in **loss of business and revenue.**

Impact on Development of Adjacent Property: The property on our SE boundary, adjacent to Glen Eden Road between Glen Eden and Horsethief Canyon has been slated for development - most recent plans were paused during the last recession. This potential will undoubtedly be adversely affected by this project. Any future development would require undergrounding of utilities - so why not do it now, rather than have to relocate utilities yet again when development happens?

Safety: We reside in a high fire risk area. Above-ground utilities are exposed and can present a hazard if they are breached in any way.

The fact that utilities are being placed underground around nearby housing developments shows that undergrounding utilities is surely the only way forward in residential areas - and the Temescal Valley is

rapidly becoming a high density residential area. Once again, we respectfully request that the CPUC and SCEdison reconsider the long term effect of this development and do it in a way that is less impactful to residents and visitors.

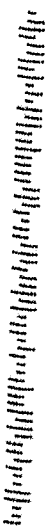

My Name is Richard Dean and I have lived in the Horsetheif Canyon Ranch neighborhood for the past 8 years. I have become invested in this community and have decided to raise my family in this community, so when I see a project like this I have some concerns and oppositions. For the sake of clarity, I will categorize my concerns in the following points:

- Safety
- Traffic Congestion
- Aesthetics and Environmental impact
- Constructive Criticisms and Suggestions

1. Safety

One of the biggest dangers to our community is fire. If you have not visited our neck of the woods, we are surrounded by forest on one side, and a natural desert landscape on the other. Even before the drought, fires were a real concern for our community due to the fact that the ridgeline of the Cleveland forest is to our west and winds coming from the west are powerful and could potentially whip up any embers or fires in our area. It's scary because it has the potential to spread quickly. We know this, and we live here anyway because we wanted to be close to nature and be further away from the overdevelopment happening in nearby Corona and Riverside. It's one thing to move into a place fully aware of the risks of living in the neighborhood. It's a totally different thing when we are asked to consider adding additional risk by adding high capacity power lines which could potentially add to our fire danger. Now we know that no one's intention is to add to this, or cause a potentially dangerous situation, but now would be the time to speak up about such dangers and how to alleviate them.

2. Traffic Congestion

You may not be aware, but there are many factors in our immediate vicinity which will potentially alter the traffic situation in our neighborhood in a negative way. Already starting construction are the Terramore Estates. To my south Lake Elsinore is looking at developing over 8,000 homes as part of their Alberhill Villages project. To our North, another community called the Arrantine Hills has just been given the go ahead, which

will add over 2000 new homes. All of these homes will have a huge impact on the traffic of not only the 15 Freeway, but also Temescal Canyon Road which is our primary alternative route should the Freeway become overly congested. If we are conservative, if each one of these new homes add only 2 cars per home to the morning commute, that's over 20,000 new cars to our local roadways. Should all of these projects come to fruition it's almost a lock that the 15 freeway would have to be expanded as well as all of the secondary roads. To further emphasize this point, on December 1, 2015, a tanker truck exploded on the southbound 15 Freeway and because of that all of our secondary roads were completely jammed with traffic. I work in Riverside City, and a normal commute to Horsetheif Canyon is between 45 minutes to 1 hour. On that day, I left work at 4pm and did not get home until 9. All of that was because of our inadequate secondary roads. It's completely understandable to expect congestion because of such an incident, but that was excessive. I previously have worked in Yosemite, and the standing rule was that there needed to be 3 accessible fire roads to get out should a fire approach. Horsetheif has only 2 currently.

Why does this even concern your project? Logic dictates there are only 3 possible ways to alleviate all of this incoming traffic. One is to create a roadway from our neighborhood over the hill into Orange County, which is unlikely due to the cost and environmental objections. The second would be to create a backway into Lake Elsinore, which would also have the same costs and environmental issues as the first option. The third and most likely option is to widen the 15 Freeway and Temescal Canyon roads, which is more likely because it would be an easier project to complete because work has already been done to accommodate that. This would directly impact your proposed substation because it would act as a barrier to that freeway project and creating a traffic chokepoint.

3. Aesthetics and Environmental Impact

I by no means am a card carrying member of the Green Party, but I can appreciate the nature around our community. Part of the selling point of our house was that it was away from the city, was near the trees and had amazing views. My wife is an asthmatic, so the fact that the air is cleaner up here was a big plus as she can walk around the neighborhood and breathe easier here than in Riverside. It makes a difference to the quality of our lives. We appreciate the views that we see from our home. We enjoy the trails, running, hiking and other outdoor opportunities this community has to offer. We moved here knowing that living so close to nature would have disadvantages like being away from major shopping and having to deal with the occasional coyote sighting, but we chose those tradeoffs because we loved the neighborhood. I fear that having large transmission towers would not only have an irreparable impact on our views of the

natural surroundings, but I fear it would also have a negative impact on the wildlife in the area. My in-laws lived in north Fontana in the Hunters Ridge community, and they had similar lines nearby. I can still remember the buzzing we would hear from those lines as well as how they would absolutely block what would be a picturesque view. It's a concern that they would not only be an eyesore, but also lower our property values.

Constructive Criticism and Suggestions

After voicing our concerns, our suggestions and desires for this project are the following:

1. Because of our Concerns about the impact on the environment, natural views, the ability to widen roads to alleviate traffic and to lessen the potential of such a project creating an unintended fire, our family supports **VIG Alternative M** which would require all of the lines to be buried underground. Doing so would alleviate most, if not all of our concerns for the immediate and foreseeable future.
2. We **do not support the creation of the Alberhill substation** because its location will create issues with the eventual widening of the 15 Freeway and secondary roads which will need to happen within the next few years. We also do not support this station site because of the impact it will have on the nearby environment as well as the impact on views.
3. Being a Horsetheif resident, I completely sympathize with the residents of Spanish Hills who do not want the project in their neighborhood either if it were built on the Serrano site. I would encourage the Committee to work with those residents to develop a secondary plan that would meet their community and our communities concerns. However, if no alternative site can be found, our family would **tentatively support the Serrano Site** being that it is closer to the El Sobrante Landfill and will have less impact on homes and natural wildlife.

In Closing, I know no neighborhood wants this in their backyard. It's completely understandable. The approach that needs to be taken is the one that has minimal impact on fire safety, traffic and the natural environment. It should also be said that if the commission can find a site that is out of site for the most of the region, that would be helpful also. We all moved to south Riverside County to enjoy the natural beauty that the area has to offer and would hate for such intrusion to mar the landscape.

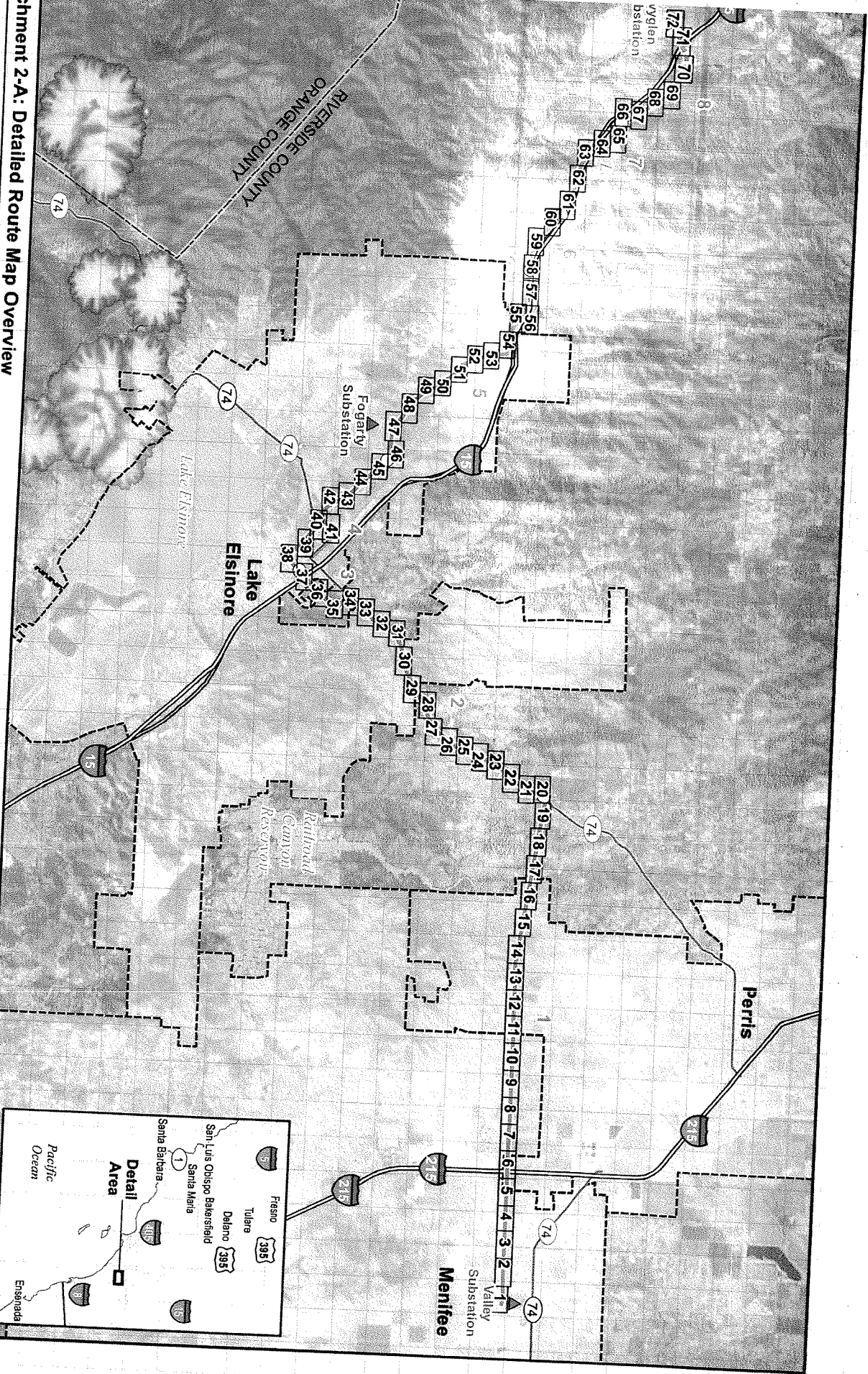

I live in the Horsethief Canyon community and the postcard I recently received is the first I can recall hearing about this Valley-Ivy Glen project. Perhaps notices were sent in the past and I simply missed them or forgot them. If they came in the same form as this recent postcard it would not be a stretch to imagine they were discarded with the normal junk mail we receive on an almost daily basis. In the future I suggest a standard letter with some indication of what is inside so it isn't discarded. Anyway, moving on to the issue at hand, I simply would like to remind the CPUC that its purpose is

"The CPUC serves the public interest by protecting consumers and ensuring the provision of safe, reliable utility service and infrastructure at reasonable rates, with a commitment to environmental enhancement and a healthy California economy"

It is unclear to me how this project benefits our community. What is clear is that there will be transmission lines running overhead near our neighborhood. Clearly that is NOT a positive impact for our community. I can tell you that the residents here would AT BEST be indifferent and at worst be upset with the construction of these lines. There are also obvious concerns with fire. Will there be contractual obligations for Edison to take steps to reduce the risks of fires spreading from these lines to the community during construction and after the lines are operational both upon completion and indefinitely as long as the lines are in use? Will we receive lower rates once this project is completed? Will those rates be legally guaranteed for some significant future period? Again, I ask, what is the benefit to our existing community?

I know there are plans for a significant amount of construction to north of our community but I frankly don't care about those projects. Those projects provide no tangible benefit to me, my family, or the community. If those projects need additional power I suggest they take a longer less direct route to reach those sites and let those companies that are building absorb the additional costs.

Please remember that you are tasked with acting in OUR (the public) interest. That means that if this project is going to create a negative impact on the EXISTING residents in order to help some corporation make money and/or create new residents then it should be altered to eliminate the negative impact on those of us that are already here.

Also please remember that most of the people here are working class. With the traffic problems around this area many are working what amounts to a full-time and a part-time job when factoring in the traffic delays. People just don't have the time and energy to educate themselves about issues that are years away and that only present themselves as small postcards that must be read and further researched. Taking the time to read, understand, and take action on these projects is not going to be done by the vast majority of the people here. On the other hand, the Edison people involved in this project have a financial stake in getting this done. For the individuals, it is the job they are paid for and for the company there is a profit motive behind each and every one of their actions. If there were a significant financial incentive for members in this community to educate themselves and closely examine this project for negative impacts to our area I can guarantee you the feedback you receive would be enormous.

So I simply ask you, the members of the CPUC, to keep in mind that any negative impacts this project has on our existing community should be far outweighed by the positive impacts (if any) to our neighbors and family. After reviewing the environmental impact report I found many troubling aspects to the proposed dual projects that are not addressed.

1. The project will benefit 11 cities in the region, yet the majority of the impacts will be felt in one community - Lake Elsinore and its sphere of influence. Lake Elsinore is an economically disadvantaged region and three projects, as proposed, would further impact the aesthetic and economic development opportunities in this area. The recommendations in the EIR should look to protect this community, but instead draws excuses for why impacts might not be mitigated. The goal should be to "do no harm" to the existing residents and that is not the case here.
2. Not one inch of power lines are recommended to be placed underground within the City of Lake Elsinore. Power poles are recommended where utilities have already been buried along Central Avenue, erasing decades of progress in this area.
3. No alternative routes were analyzed. The projects cut straight through the heart of Lake Elsinore, with the recommended configuration adding hundreds of new poles very near where there are existing poles.
4. State Route Highway 74 is a State-designated Scenic Corridor. No mention of this in the EIR. No mitigation proposed to protect or improve the aesthetic here.
5. The EIR cites that above ground poles are needed to protect endangered habitat, yet there were no studies to analyze the endangered species impacted by the proposed route.
6. The EIR downplays the aesthetic impact by providing very few visual representations of the impacts, almost entirely from the freeway, and always from far away. The EIR should include the impacts from all city streets.
7. The EIR should analyze the potential economic development impacts to the region. Locating a power pole is expensive. Relocating power poles kills projects and can make valuable land rendered worthless, which may be construed as a take. Poles located in a residential neighborhoods impact home values and contribute to the "broken window" syndrome.

Overall, the EIR, which is supposed to be a third party analysis prepared with an eye toward protecting the people and environment, falls woefully short of this task. The report and the presentation to the public both seemed short-armed, biased in favor of SCE, and poorly reviewed.

I am seeking Option M, which would require all lines be placed underground.

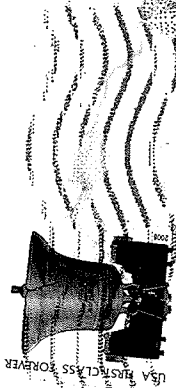

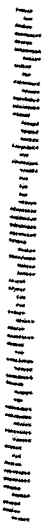

We moved here from Orange County six years ago in large part for the "rural" feeling in a little slice of otherwise densely populated Southern California. As it stands now, our area is frequently effected by issues relating to the power lines including car crashes into the lines dotting Temescal Canyon and coming in to Horsethief Canyon Ranch - one just six weeks ago caused power outages for several hours in mandatory repairs well into the night, impacting 10,000+ homes. I feel that it is cheap and cutting corners to skip not putting the lines underground, especially where the area is projected to have so much growth. We are also in a large brush area (I pay the mandatory state fire fee for being "rural" and "too close to brush" even though I am surrounded by 1900 other homes), putting power lines above ground and over a freeway is asking for trouble. Southern California Edison (SCE) filed a Petition for Modification (PFM) of California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) Decision 10-08-009 granting SCE a Permit to Construct (PTC) the Valley-Ivyglen Subtransmission Line (proposed Valley-Ivyglen Project) in western Riverside County. As a separate action, SCE filed an application for a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity (CPCN) with the CPUC to construct and operate the Alberhill System Project (proposed Alberhill Project). Both of the proposed projects would be constructed within and in proximity to the City of Lake Elsinore, California, in an area between SCE's Valley Substation to the east and Ivyglen Substation to the west. The two projects would be constructed within the same right-of-way (ROW) from the intersection of Collier Avenue and Third Street in the City of Lake Elsinore northwest approximately 6.5 miles to the proposed Alberhill Substation site.

Within this ROW, the 115-kV conductor required for the proposed Alberhill Project would be installed on the 115-kV structures constructed as part of the proposed Valley–Ivyglen Project.

As the Lead Agency under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) for review of the two proposed projects, the CPUC determined that it would be in the public’s best interest to consolidate the CEQA analyses for the proposed Valley–Ivyglen Project PFM application and the proposed Alberhill Project CPCN application into a single CEQA document since the components of the proposed Valley–Ivyglen Project are required for construction of the proposed Alberhill Project, and the two proposed projects would be constructed during the same period.

The purpose of this Notice of Availability (NOA) is to announce that the CPUC’s Draft Environmental Impact Report (EIR) is available for public review and comment.

Description of the Proposed Projects

Proposed Valley–Ivyglen Project

The primary components of the proposed Valley–Ivyglen Project would include:

- Construction of a new, single-circuit 115-kV subtransmission line and fiber optic line. The route would be approximately 27-miles long and constructed within approximately 23 miles of new ROW. The line would traverse unincorporated Riverside County and the cities of Menifee, Perris, and Lake Elsinore.
- Installation of overhead fiber optic lines on the proposed structures and underground in new (approximately 10,000 feet) and existing (approximately 13,200 feet) conduit.
- Transfer of existing distribution circuits along portions of the proposed subtransmission line to new 115-kV structures or to underground positions.
- Installation of new 115 kV switching and protective equipment at both Valley and Ivyglen Substations.

From the existing Valley Substation, in the City of Menifee, the proposed 115-kV line would traverse in a generally west direction through areas within the City of Menifee, City of Perris, City of Lake Elsinore, and unincorporated areas of western Riverside County to the existing Ivyglen Substation. The proposed route would cross Interstate 215 (I-215), State Route 74 (SR-74), and Interstate 15 (I-15). Fiber optic lines would be installed overhead on the proposed structures and underground in new and existing conduits.

Construction of the proposed Valley–Ivyglen Project would take approximately 27 months. It is anticipated that the proposed Valley–Ivyglen Project would be operational by fall/winter 2018.

No portion of the proposed Valley–Ivyglen Project would be located on a hazardous materials site identified under Government Code Section 65962.5.

Proposed Alberhill Project

The primary components of the proposed Alberhill Project would include:

- Construction of a new 1,120 megavolt ampere (MVA) 500/115-kV substation (Alberhill Substation), which would be expandable to a maximum of 1,680 MVA depending on future need. The substation would be built on approximately 34 acres of a 124-acre property located on the northwest corner of the intersection of Temescal Canyon Road and Concordia Ranch Road in unincorporated western Riverside County;
- Construction of two new 500-kV transmission lines (approximately 3.3 miles, combined) within a new ROW to connect the proposed Alberhill Substation to the existing Serrano–Valley 500-kV Transmission Line;

- Construction of approximately 11.75 miles of new double-circuit 115-kV subtransmission lines and removal of 11 miles of existing single-circuit 115-kV subtransmission lines within primarily in the existing ROW;
- Construction of about 3 miles of single-circuit 115-kV subtransmission lines with distribution lines underbuilt on the subtransmission line structures and removal of about 3 miles of electrical distribution lines within the existing ROW;
- Installation of a second 115 kV circuit on approximately 6.5 miles of single-circuit 115-kV subtransmission lines (the single-circuit lines are to be constructed as part of the proposed Valley–Ivyglen Project);
- Installation of fiber optic lines overhead (9 miles) on sections of the new or modified subtransmission lines and underground (1 mile) in proximity to the proposed Alberhill Substation and several of the existing 115/12-kV substations;
- Construction of an approximately 120-foot microwave antenna tower at the proposed Alberhill Substation site; installation of microwave telecommunications dish antennas at the proposed Alberhill Substation, the existing Santiago Peak Communications Site, and Serrano Substation; and other telecommunications equipment installations at existing and proposed substations; and
- Transfer of 5 of the 14 Valley South 115-kV System substations to the proposed Alberhill 115- kV System: the Ivyglen, Fogarty, Elsinore, Skylark, and Newcomb 115/12-kV substations.

The Alberhill Substation is proposed to be built on 34 to 40¹ acres of a 124-acre property located north of I-15 and the intersection of Temescal Canyon Road and Concordia Ranch Road in unincorporated western Riverside County. The two new 500-kV transmission lines would each extend approximately 1.5 miles northeast to connect the proposed Alberhill Substation to the existing Serrano–Valley 500 kV Transmission Line. The two 500-kV transmission lines would be constructed primarily in unincorporated Riverside County, although the transmission lines would pass through the City of Lake Elsinore.

The proposed 115-kV line modifications and construction would occur southeast from the proposed Alberhill Substation to Skylark Substation (approximately 11.5 miles) and from Skylark Substation to Newcomb Substation (approximately 9 miles). The subtransmission lines would be modified or constructed in unincorporated Riverside County and in the Cities of Lake Elsinore, Wildomar, and Menifee.

One new approximately 120-foot microwave antenna tower would be installed at the proposed Alberhill Substation; one new microwave dish antenna would be installed at Serrano Substation in the City of Orange in Orange County; and two new dish antennas would be installed at the Santiago Peak Communications Site, which is located on land managed by the United States Forest Service within the Cleveland National Forest. Construction of the proposed Alberhill Project would take approximately 28 months. It is anticipated that the proposed Alberhill Project would be operational by summer 2019.

No portion of the proposed Alberhill Project would be located on a hazardous materials site identified under Government Code Section 65962.5.

Significant Adverse Environmental Impacts from the Proposed Projects

Proposed Valley–Ivyglen Project

For the proposed Valley–Ivyglen Project, three significant adverse impacts have been identified. The proposed Valley–Ivyglen Project would result in a significant adverse environmental impact related to Air Quality, Noise and Vibration, and Cumulative Impacts.

Proposed Alberhill Project

For the proposed Alberhill Project, four significant adverse impacts have been identified. The proposed Alberhill Project would result in a significant adverse environmental impact related to Aesthetics, Air Quality, Noise and Vibration, and Cumulative Impacts.

Thank you for the opportunity to comment on the Draft Environmental Impact Report for the Ivyglen Subtransmission Line Project. As long-time residents of the Temescal Valley, and long-time members of Glen Eden Sun Club, we have reviewed the Draft EIR before the California Public Utilities Commission. As stated in our letter regarding the Notice of Preparation for this project in June 2015, we continue to have significant concerns about the adverse impacts the project would impose upon the Temescal Valley, and Glen Eden, particularly along the boundary of Glen Eden's property on DePalma Road between Indian Truck Trail and Horsethief Canyon Road, as shown in Figure 4.1-4a of the Draft EIR.

While we are not against the need to upgrade utilities for the Temescal Valley and Glen Eden, we believe that such projects should take into account the visual and consequential economic impact to local residents, businesses, and communities. The visual change would be substantial, invasive and alarming.

The project calls for reducing the span of the power poles currently along DePalma from an average of 200 feet to 80 feet, and increasing the maximum pole height by as much as 80 feet. The anticipated impact would create significant visual intrusion and blight conditions along DePalma Road. This is a semi-rural area that would be devastated by the construction of the proposed above-ground utility structures along Glen Eden's property line. The existing power poles directly in front of Glen Eden stand well underneath the tree line, where they are visually obscured by foliage. The proposed power poles would tower above the tree line; Glen Eden's single cell tower would be subsumed by a cascade of monster poles.

We requested in our letter from June 2015 that the EIR consider the alternative of undergrounding the subtransmission line along DePalma Road between Indian Truck Trail and Horsethief Canyon Road. While there is no such alternative considered in the Draft EIR, the review does contain Alternative M, which would underground the new lines along the entire stretch of the project. This fails to address that there may be some areas where above-ground

installation would be appropriate, and instead creates an all-or-nothing alternative which may check a box for academic analysis but is worthless from a practical standpoint.

We respectfully renew our request that the CPUC consider undergrounding that segment of the project along Glen Eden's property boundary where the impact is greatest on Glen Eden's well established neighborhood, which deserves protection from being trapped behind a tightly packed row of concrete spears and wires.

Glen Eden, as a residential neighborhood that has been in business for 50 years and whose residents, members and guests are intimately familiar with the area, we strongly believe that the aesthetic and environmental conditions resulting from this project would have a significant, lasting and detrimental impact on Glen Eden's property, and residents and guests. As we stated in our June 2015 letter, the existing power poles directly in front of Glen Eden stand well underneath the tree line, where they are visually obscured by foliage. Installing the proposed structures over the two years that construction is contemplated would be a jarring, harmful and ultimately unnecessary intrusion onto the peaceful enjoyment of Glen Eden's property when a practical alternative exists that was ignored in the Draft EIR.

It is worth repeating our requests from June 2015 since they were not incorporated into the Draft EIR:

- Underground the portion of the project (added Segment 7) from Horsethief Canyon Road along the length of DePalma Road.
- Relocate the proposed guard structure from the corner of DePalma Road and Glen Eden Road elsewhere to an unpopulated location along DePalma or to the other side of Interstate 15 along Temescal Canyon Road, not in front of a residential neighborhood.
- Relocate helicopter use during construction to avoid the area of Glen Eden Sun Club.

Glen Eden is a business. They rely on continual marketing efforts to attract new members and retain membership. If the front, and first impression, of Glen Eden is permanently scarred by this installation, it will seriously impact its ability to attract and retain members, resulting in loss of business and revenue.


The property on the Glen Eden's southeast boundary, adjacent to Glen Eden Road between Glen Eden and the Horsethief community, has been slated for development - most recent plans were paused during the last recession. This potential will undoubtedly be adversely affected by this project. Any future development would require undergrounding of utilities – so why not do it now, rather than have to relocate utilities yet again when development happens ?

The fact that utilities are being placed underground in nearby housing developments, shows that undergrounding utilities is surely the only way to go forward in residential areas – and the Temescal Valley is rapidly becoming a high density residential area. Once again, we respectfully request that the CPUC and Southern California Edison reconsider the long term

effect of this project, and do it in a way that is less impactful to the Temescal Valley, and residents and visitors to Glen Eden.

We will continue to monitor the project as it moves through other stages of the process. We urge the CPUC to consider the viable Alternative M, or partial undergrounding just along Segment 7 of the project in front of Glen Eden property because of the adverse and cumulative impacts on Glen Eden's existing residential community. Please assure that the Paul family, and the Glen Eden Sun Club are added to all communications regarding the EIR and associated reports for this project.

We find after reading this report that the Alberhill Project will cause significant impact on the environment. The files shown at the beginning of the disk are out of order and therefore are difficult to read. I asked at the May 11, 2016 meeting for a paper copy and I was refused, even though there was a copy on the table. How can a senior citizen, not brought-up with computers be expected to read from this disk.

When I put the disk in the computer, the date of the disk was April, 2008. Why is this disk so old? Was the data collected eight years ago?

Since I only have ten days to prepare my response, I did not study the 17 alternatives. My alternative is 3.3.6 no construction.

The CPUC should determine that this project has too many significant impacts to be approved.

The two projects should not have been combined.

The Alberhill Project has too many identified adverse effects on the environment. The biological resources MSHCP must protect biodiversity. The cumulative impacts would be devastating.

This project will take 28 months to complete. Therefore, when it states that it will cause temporary harm to humans, Edison is trying to deceive us. Humans, animals, and plants should not be harmed. I request that I be placed in the status of PARTY to this project.

Our air quality is already poor. SCAQMD requires that there be an air quality study. I did not find that study on the disc. The Clean Air Act requires that you protect the public's health. As elderly persons, my husband, 78, and I, 73, should not be subjected to an increase in air pollution. This will increase our mortality risk. According to the data Ambient Air pollution exceeds the levels set. These studies were done in 2013. With the increase in population, these studies must be repeated. I would like to read this new report. This project is designated non-attainable in several areas. This report provides information on TOXIC AIR CONTAMINANTS. It is your responsibility to have Edison prove they will reduce TAC. Our Federal laws require it. The increase of diesel contamination over a 28 month period is not acceptable. I hope all residence in the 1,640 foot radius receive a letter explaining how their lives would be endangered. The school district should be notified. Will the school be closed? This, a health problem, and an economical one as well when the medical urgent care facility is closed. I cannot find the data on how the CARB emissions will be regulated. According to CCAA this is required.

Has the project obtained SCAB permits? Please send me a copy of the permits. I would like to see SCAQMD rule 1113 and others which may apply to this project. These rules should not be amended. Under cumulative effects this project exceeds significant thresholds.

In rule 403 chemical stabilizers could be used. What effect would they have on the plants and animals. Also, what is the source of water being used? Has EVMWD approved this usage during our severe drought.

I will defer to the city of Lake Elsinore to protect the people in this habitat area.

After reading page 4.3-11, this project creates a significant danger even with mitigation. (MMAQ-3).

If this project is approved, we the people will still be exposed to dangerous health threats. Edison cannot pollute my air. Mitigation does not reduce pollutants to less than significant. Discussion of emissions state "tier for engines that would be used is not known". This statement nullifies this study. This study is based on inadequate data. Also, the cost of buying credits is prohibitive. If you approve this project, Edison should be required to spend the money.

I do not find the documentation required to be submitted before construction. VOC/ROG, etc.

In table 4.3-12, I find that thresholds exceeds the legal limit in 10 places. This to my mind is grounds for stopping this project.

Section 1.1.1.3 planning standards are not written for the average person. What are NERC, and WECC? Caiso adheres to them. Where is the data on the Valley-Elsinore Fogarty segment?

The Alberhill Project as preposed will take up to 34 acres. It will be modified. I would like to comment again after these changes are made.

According to Riverside General Plan, policy LU 13.5 requires new communication distribution lines be placed underground. Highway 74 and I-15 are scenic corridors. Additional data must be collected for this report.

I do not believe a habitat restoration plan will restore these areas. For example, how will the Thread-leafed Brodiaea be protected? The Coastal California Gnat Catcher habitat should not be disturbed. I do not see a study on the Acorn Woodpecker and how it will be effected by the removal of the wooden poles.

The 27 month construction period would result in significant impact. I would like to read the Cal-Trans and Transportation Departments reports concerning this issue. Lake Street is another area in which impact would be significant. Under grounding should be required.

I would like EVMWD to review the landscaping and irrigation plan. I did not find the landscape architect's plan. This must be completed before this project goes forward.

An earthquake study needs to be conducted on the new poles. Will theses poles remain standing in the event of an earthquake along the local fault.

Biological resources are of significant concern. During scoping in 2008 Edison received comments from the following agencies: CDFW, RCHCA, SKR, MSHCP. Please send them to me. I have concerns about the comments from the above agencies since this project is base upon their data "components of the preposed Alberhill project are not discussed further in this section". This makes the report incomplete. Therefore, by combining the two projects you must cancel both.

The status plant methods used by the hired biologist is incomplete. The data was not collected during the optimal blooming period. My husband and I are retired teachers, if we can see the errors, something is seriously wrong with this report. Their survey methods are faulty. As an avid bird watcher, I request another company be hired to do the surveys.

Vernal pools should be placed under "jurisdictional waters" . These pools would be permanently destroyed. And no amount of mitigation can change the significant impact.

Other errors occur where the term "minor construction" is used. Construction and operation would be significant.

I would like the RCA to update their PSE application to include all of the new areas added to the 2016 report.

Also, 141.5 acres of special status wildlife will be permanently disturbed. This is not acceptable. For example, the 12 oak trees cannot be moved or destroyed. The permits for this destruction should not be issued. If this project were to be approved Edison would have to hire staff to monitor this site as per ESA, CESA, MSHCH and SKRHCP during construction. In my opinion there will be significant damage to these plants and animals.

My grandfather, John Lampo lived in Alberhill for several years. I enjoyed visiting. I imagined myself going to school in the one room school. The Lake Elsinore Historical Society has several pictures and artifacts from this era. This area is historically significant, and must be protected.

Edison should provide a copy of the SWRCB Geotracter and DTSC Environster data base. This report is not complete without it. We the people should be able to read all the data. I would like an explanation of the problem with Pacific Clay and why the case was closed. Also, Phase one ESA was not conducted. This must be completed before the project can be approved.

It appears Edison does not own the property where this project takes place. How is this possible?

We live in a hazardous fire area. Cal-Fire has determined this to be a very high fire hazard severity zone. What recourse do I have if a fire starts as a result of this project.

According to the data, this project will be built on the Elsinore fault. There also could be an expansive soil event, as you know, a major quake is overdue. A geotechnical investigation must be completed prior to permitting this project.

The California building code requires an NFDES permit. Has this been obtained?

Mitigation measures will not bring this project to less significant. How do you know it is less significant without the final engineering design.

I would like to read the complete habitat restoration and revegetation plan.

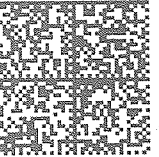
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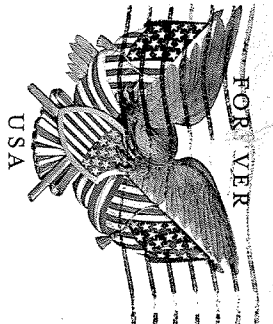

This is to notify the California Public Utilities Commission and Southern California Edison that the power lines for the Valley-Ivyglen Subtransmission Line project should be placed underground. Therefore, VIG Alternative M better serves the Temescal Valley community for the following reasons.

- The Temescal Valley has many earthquake fault lines. Should an earthquake occur, the above ground power lines would fall on Interstate 15 Freeway and/or Temescal Canyon road. Thus, effectively blocking community members from escaping the Temescal Valley. These fallen lines would block first responders from entering the Temescal Valley to provide emergency services until Southern California Edison work crews could reach and repair the fallen/broken lines. Down power lines could take weeks to reach and repair resulting in community member fatalities or injuries.
- Temescal Valley is in a high fire area. In case of fire, above ground power lines would impede the effective fire fighting activities of aircraft (helicopters). Thus it would take longer to fight the fire and result in more structures/property being damaged or destroyed until the fire is under control. This would increase the potential for loss of life.
- The above ground power lines would reduce property values, pose a health risk and negatively impact the Temescal Valley aesthetics.

The alternative to the Alberhill Project identified as ASP Alternative DD (Serrano Commerce Center Substation Site) would have a significantly negative impact in the following areas and therefore the placement of the Alberhill Substation should remain located at the proposed Substation Site.

- This location would significantly limit the type of commercial and residential development around the substation.
- Devaluation of residential and commercial property values surrounding the substation.
- This area is adjacent to a flood plain and would be difficult to access in case of a flood situation.
- In the case of an earthquake, fire or weather event in which the above ground power lines fall to the ground, the residents surrounding the substation would be blocked from exiting their community via the Temescal Canyon Road and/or the Interstate 15 Freeway.
- Many of the businesses that would potentially locate in the Serrano Commerce Center not locate near the substation site. This would have a significant negative economic impact on the Temescal Valley and Riverside County.
- Expansion of the Temescal Canyon Road through the Serrano Commerce Center would be jeopardized with the placement of the substation in the Serrano Commerce Center.
- A greater number of community residents and businesses would be impacted by the placement of the substation in the Serrano Commerce Center versus placement in the proposed substation site.
- Placement of the substation in the Serrano Commerce Center would negatively impact the Temescal Valley aesthetics, property values, health and quality of life.

Transmission Line Right of Way Constraints and Guidelines

The primary purpose of SCE's Transmission Rights of Way (ROW) and Substations is to house SCE's electrical system and related facilities. SCE is committed to ensuring it operates and maintains a safe and reliable electric system, both, now and in the future.

The use of SCE's ROW is guided by California Public Utilities Commission regulations (General Order No. 69-C), which define the need to protect utility system operations and provide guidance on overall uses of the ROW, the types of agreements allowed, and related approval processes.

If you are proposing uses within SCE's ROW, please ensure that you contact SCE prior to developing your plans. Any proposed uses must be compatible, low-intensity uses (i.e. green belts, bike and hiking trails, etc.) that do not impose additional constraints on SCE's ability to maintain and operate its current facilities and that do not interfere with any future operating facility needs.

The following are constraints and guidelines to assist in the development of your plans within SCE's transmission ROW.

1. All projects are unique and will be reviewed on a case by case basis.
2. Buildings and other permanent structures, both, above ground and underground, are prohibited within SCE's ROW. Examples of permanent structures are pipelines, concrete slabs, foundations, vaults, decks, detention basins, pools, and anything else that is not portable and easily movable.
3. No parallel or longitudinal encroachments will be permitted. All improvements crossing in the ROW must do so perpendicular to the centerline of the ROW.
4. Any proposed use(s) on SCE's ROW that are specifically prohibited in SCE's easement document will be denied.
5. SCE's access to its ROW and facilities must be maintained 24/7 and cannot be encumbered in order to ensure SCE's access for system operations, maintenance, and emergency response.
6. All proposed grading requires a clearance review. Costs for engineered conductor clearance reviews required by SCE are to be paid for by the requestor.
7. All users of SCE's land shall be responsible for compliance with all applicable federal, state, county, and local laws affecting use of SCE's land. The user must obtain all permits and other governmental approvals required for the proposed use.
8. No plant species protected by federal or state law shall be planted within SCE's ROW.
9. All new trees and shrubs proposed on SCE's ROW shall be slow growing and not exceed 15 feet in height.
10. No wetlands, other sensitive natural habitat, vegetation related natural plant areas, or environmental mitigation on SCE's ROW will be permitted as it creates interference with SCE's ability to access its facilities and to add future facilities.
11. Groundwater or storm water infiltration or recharge will not be allowed.
12. Flammable or combustible materials are not allowed to be used or stored on SCE's ROW.
13. SCE may require a third-party user to implement certain safety measures or mitigations as a condition to approval of the third-party use. Users of SCE's ROW must adhere to minimum grounding standards dictated by SCE.

14. Uses on SCE's ROW will not be approved if deemed unsafe. An example of an unsafe condition includes (but is not limited to) instances where the proposed use may create levels of induced voltage that are unsafe to SCE employees or the public that cannot be mitigated to safe levels.

The Riverside County Transportation Department (County) appreciates the opportunity to submit comments on the Draft Environmental Impact Report (EIR) for the Alberhill System Project (ASP) and Valley-Ivyglen Subtransmission Line Project (VIG). The projects propose to develop a new 500/115-kV substation, new 500-kV transmission lines, new and modified 115-kV subtransmission lines with telecommunications system installations. The extent of the projects span across six Area Plans in Riverside County: Temescal Canyon, Elsinore, Mead Valley, Sun City/Menifee, and Harvest Valley/Winchester.

Our concerns are focused on the impacts ASP and VIG will have on the County's ability to construct new or expand existing roadways within our jurisdiction, particularly Temescal Canyon Road. The EIR simply does not provide sufficient information related to the location of the poles and transmission lines in order to determine their impacts to County roadways.

Temescal Canyon Road

North of Indian Truck Trail, the County's General Plan Circulation Element designates Temescal Canyon Road as an Arterial Highway with an 86-foot paved section and 128-foot full-width right-of-way. This portion of Temescal Canyon Road predominantly coincides with Segment VIG8 identified on Figure 2.2a in the EIR. As described on Pages 2-15 and 2-21, Segment VIG8 would be installed underground along Temescal Canyon Road within new right-of-way. The information provided only gives a general depiction where the VIG8 components will be installed, however the EIR needs to provide scaled plans with cross sections identifying the location of improvements relative to the existing road and right-of-way. The County views Temescal Canyon Road as a critical roadway for the area, serving as an emergency access route and providing relief as congestion develops on the freeway. Therefore improvements made by VIG and/or ASP that impede the County's ability to improve and widen Temescal Canyon Road would be highly detrimental to traffic safety and mobility and would be considered an impact.

The County is currently working to develop an alignment study for Temescal Canyon Road between Indian Truck Trail and Lake Street. This would cover Segments VIG5 and VIG6 shown on Figure 2.2a where poles and subtransmission lines are proposed to be installed on one or both sides of Temescal Canyon Road. The County requests the CPUC to require the project applicant to coordinate its design of Segments VIG5 and VIG6 with the County's alignment study for reasons mentioned previously.

State Route 74

An effort has begun to relinquish portions of State Route 74 between the Cities of Lake Elsinore and Perris to the County (refer to 2015-2016 AB-218). Additionally, in anticipation of this effort, the County is initiating a Project Study Report that would study an east-west corridor between I-215 and I-15 through a route utilizing Ethanac Road ultimately aligning and connecting to the Nichols Road interchange. This route overlaps with Segments VIG1 and VIG2. We request that the project applicant be required to coordinate with the County in order to develop a plan that works for both the road and utility projects.

General Plan Circulation Element Roadways

Alternatives to the proposed project utilize Temescal Canyon Road to a lesser extent, however roadways such as Campbell Ranch Road and De Palma Road are still employed. Comments made on Temescal Canyon Road apply similarly to other General Plan designated roadways in the County. Refer to County's General Plan Circulation Element for roadway designations and Ordinance 461 for detailed roadway design standards.

Encroachment permits

The County concurs with the EIR that the projects are required to obtain encroachment permits for each affected County roadway or other transportation right-of-way. Detail design plans of the proposed pole locations shall be submitted to the County for review and concurrence.

General Plan Circulation Element Policies

In addition to the County General Plan Policies related to roadway level of service, the Circulation Element also includes the policy below related to utility infrastructure.

C 20.5

In order to protect the watershed, water supply, groundwater recharge, and wildlife values of watercourses, the County of Riverside will avoid siting utility infrastructure and associated grading, fire clearance, and other disturbances within or adjacent to watercourses, if there are feasible alternatives available, and discourage special districts and other governmental jurisdictions outside of Riverside County's authority, from doing so. Where such watershed utility siting locations cannot be avoided, the impacts on watercourses shall be minimized.

We appreciate the importance of providing safe and reliable electrical service for anticipated growth, however it is essential that the CPUC and applicant work with us in order to eliminate any incompatibilities between the ultimate roadways and utilities.



I am a resident of the City of Lake Elsinore and I am writing to you in regards to the Southern California Edison's proposed Valley-Ivyglen and Alberhill System Projects.

I understand the need for more electrical capacity in our region but I believe there are other alternative projects that would serve the need with less environmental impacts on the surrounding areas.

I have the following concerns:

The aesthetic analysis was significantly skewed in favor of the client proposing the project. The described vividness of the existing conditions are invalid as the viewpoint directions were focused on the actual roadways/highways, instead of the surrounding visual views and amenities. The descriptions of the inactness of the existing conditions is invalid as it also focuses on the roadway and doesn't take into consideration the surrounding natural landscape, which would naturally vary in the types of "elements and diversity of forms, lines, colors, and textures" and have "natural appearing vegetation, background mountains, and rural character" in its surrounding elements. Please describe how this natural landscape was considered to be rated as "moderate" and "moderately-low" according to the description provided. The descriptions of the unity of the existing conditions are invalid because they are again focusing on the pavement of the scenic route itself, instead of the surrounding environment which made the roadway a scenic route. It is important to evaluate the surroundings because that is where the project infrastructure would be placed (not on the roadways). As a result, this entire aesthetic analysis is not valid. The existing analysis shall be redone to address the aesthetics of the areas where the infrastructure would be placed. Once this analysis is redone, I request that you please provide at least 2 examples of other certified, challenged, and successfully defended EIRs, where similarly existing landscapes were rated appropriately according to the existing landscape this project area offers with the implementation of similar projects and found to be considered "less than significant." The aesthetic impacts of this project would not only affect our right to the visual pleasures which surround us, but would personally impact my friends and family's property values. It would affect the economic future of our community. I urge the California Public Utilities Commission to consider the subsequent economic impact to our community as a result of the significant aesthetic impacts.

Please describe in detail the construction and operational air quality impacts to the residents and the six schools which would be impacted by the project.

In the beginning of the Greenhouse Gas Emission section, the EIR presents the potential impacts from climate change. Please explain how the anticipated climate change impacts were evaluated and specifically considered in the cumulative impact analysis for the Greenhouse Gas Emission impacts.

I did not see any impact analysis regarding demographic information. Please consider that an unequitably significant portion of the impacted constituents consist of a low-income and/or minority demographic constituency.

I urge the Public Utilities Commission to consider these impacts and the alternative projects which would most likely result in less adverse environmental impacts to the surrounding constituency, biological resources, and sensitive receptors.
