Further, the challenged decision also voids the July 5, 2006 loan instrument between Live Oak Holding, LLC and 1st Pacific Bank of California (predecessor of City National Bank) with regard to property necessary for the operation of Live Oak Springs Water Company (Live Oak), which is to be determined by a receiver appointed by the Superior Court of San Diego and identified in a survey to be completed by a licensed land surveyor. Pursuant to D.13-07-036, "Under no circumstances may City National Bank seek repayment of the loan from future revenue derived from Live Oak's ratepayers."
