The Joint Reliability Plan is an agreement of the California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) and the California Independent System Operator (ISO) to continue inter-organizational cooperation for future resource and reliability planning. The Joint Reliability Plan sets out a joint work plan that adopts common goals and guiding principles and that commits the CPUC and ISO to consider three inter-related initiatives on a proposed timeline. It does not commit to specific policy outcomes but does plan for consideration of the following initiatives through appropriate CPUC proceedings and ISO stakeholder processes: (1) multi-year resource adequacy requirements, (2) development of a market-based replacement to the ISO's existing backstop procurement tariff, and (3) development of a unified long term reliability planning assessment. Staff request the Commission adopt the Joint Reliability Plan.
