® Adopts the quantities found in Appendix D used to develop the Division of Water and Audits' recommendations.

® The Utility Audit, Finance and Compliance Branch (UAFCB) shall investigate the amount of timber revenues BBWC owes its customers and establish a payment method and schedule upon completion of its investigation and BBWC shall cooperate with UAFCB's support in bringing the company's accounting records into compliance with the Commission's Uniform System of Accounts.
