The Federal Communications Commission (FCC) has issued a Notice of Proposed Rulemaking (NPRM) in which the FCC seeks comment on the very broad question of “[w]hat is the right public policy to ensure that the Internet remains open?” Specifically, the FCC proposes to enhance its transparency rule, and to attempt for a third time to adopt rules against blocking and discrimination. The FCC also asks for comment on its statutory authority to adopt the proposed rules. Staff seeks authority to file comments.
