The Decision adopted the Phase 1 transmission Pipeline Safety Enhancement Plans (PSEPs) for San Diego Gas & Electric Company and Southern California Gas Company (SoCalGas, together the Utilities). Because the proposed budgets were deemed too rudimentary for approval, the Decision authorized two balancing accounts for the Utilities to record their incurred costs. Those costs will be subject to subsequent reasonableness review and refund. The Decision also adopted an all-party rate design settlement for the Utilities Triennial Cost Allocation Proceeding.
