Week 7: November 29 – Dec 3, 2010

December 6, 2010

I. REPRESENTATIVES, LOCATIONS AND DATES

Frank Salazar from the Campo Band of Mission Indians served as the Tribal representative to monitor construction at the Rough Acres segment respectively, from November 29 through December 4, 2010.

Clarence Brown of the Viejas Tribe served as the Tribal representative to monitor construction at the Alpine Yard segment respectively, from November 29 through December 4, 2010.

II. CONSTRUCTION ACTIVITIES

Construction activity consisted of grading and compacting at the Rough Acres segments and potholing and preparation for the Alpine Underground segment.

III. OBSERVATIONS

At the Rough Acres tracts, Mr. Salazar noted sterile soils and decomposed granite but no cultural materials on 11/29. On 11/30 he noted one small granite mano within the ESA but he was not clear whether it had been previously recorded or not. On 12/1 he moved a previously recorded green metavolcanic chopper 3 m away from any construction threat. On 12/2 he noted one small green metavolcanic flake about 10 m from the graded area in an ESA and in a previously recorded site. On 12/3 Mr. Salazar noted one large green metavolcanic flake south of the bungalow area in a previously recorded site. On 12/4 he monitored grading and noticed no cultural materials. He did note cultural material near the front gate beyond the grading area.

At the Alpine Yard location, Mr. Brown observed as potholes were excavated and as a search for an existing line was undertaken. No cultural materials were located.

IV. CONCERNS EXPRESSED

Mr. Salazar advises additional protection measures at Rough Acres #1 at the end of the runway near the west end of the lodge and further recommends that ASM record the materials when in the field.

Mr. Brown records no concerns or issues at the Alpine Yard.

V. SUMMARY

Other than the recording and additional protection above, no further concerns are noted with regard to cultural resources.
