

- A.4-2 Potential impacts regarding erosion control and watershed management are discussed in Draft EIR/EIS Section C.8, Hydrology and Water Quality; rare and endangered species, vegetation, and the Los Angeles County Oak Tree Ordinance are discussed in Section C.3, Biological Resources; archaeological and cultural resources are discussed in Section C.4, Cultural Resources. The ANF is currently in the process of assessing fuel management in the Project area. Forest Management Activities are discussed in Section C.7 of the Draft EIR/EIS.
