While replacement of the original 66-kV line with the 500-kV line will replace existing towers in Leona Valley with taller towers, it would not be a severe degradation of the scenic value of the area. We also feel that the routing through National Forest land is not a detriment to the area as it is using existing but expanded ROW.
