I was at work and when I got home, I found the fire still going and I was not allowed to go home. Nobody had time to evacuate. All my animals, (my horses (mares with new born foals), my dogs, cats, chickens, and goats)) and my house were saved by helicopter drops. The second one we had to evacuate. That was a problem because of the dirt road becoming grid locked. I only could get half of my animals out. I was saved because the fire that had come from Santa Clarita missed my ranch. With Alternative 5 and Alternative 4, Leona Valley is sandwiched in with these Transmission Lines. I do not see how I will ever have helicopter support, especially on 107th, which is a narrow canyon road with only a narrow two-lane dirt road.
