Southern California Edison Company (SCE) will be filing an application with the California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) for authority to build the Banducci Substation Project (Project), which is proposed to be constructed in the Cummings Valley region of unincorporated Kern County.

CPUC General Order 131-D, which governs this approval process, requires SCE to include in its application any written position statement received from a city or county with which SCE has reviewed the Project. The purpose of this letter is to request from you a written position statement regarding this Project.
