The Department of Conservation's Division of Oil, Gas, and Geothermal Resources (Division) has reviewed the above referenced project. The Division supervises the drilling, maintenance, and plugging and abandonment of oil, gas, and geothermal wells in California. We offer the following comment for your consideration.

The proposed project pipeline routes, including alternatives, cross the boundaries of three oil fields. However, there are no oil, gas, or injection wells within the project pipeline routes. Regardless, if excavation operations uncover a previously unrecorded well, the Division district office in Cypress must be notified; previously unrecorded wells may require remedial operations.

Consistent with existing regulatory requirements, the applicant will need to notify the Cypress district office of the Division of Oil, Gas, and Geothermal Resources if excavation operations uncover a previously unrecorded well requiring remedial attention. Please note that Mitigation Measure EC-4 addresses the potential for discovery of previously undiscovered contamination during construction. Adherence to this measure will be monitored by the CPUC.
