<p style="text-align: center;">Moderate-to-High</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Landscape elements have moderate-to-high visual appeal • Landscape attributes have a mix of moderate and high values • Landscape may contain built features that neither complement nor detract from overall visual quality
<p style="text-align: center;">Moderate</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Landscape elements are moderately appealing • Landscape attributes have common or ordinary values • Landscape may contain discordant built features but they are subordinate
<p style="text-align: center;">Low-to-Moderate</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Landscape elements have low-to-moderate appeal • Landscape has weak or missing attributes • Landscape may have prominent though not dominant discordant built features
<p style="text-align: center;">Low</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Landscape elements have low-to-no appeal • Landscape is missing some attributes • Landscape is dominated by discordant built features
