Some of you may recall that Mrs Haskin and I, out of concern over the number of cancer cases in the homes on our street nearest the power lines, conducted a household survey in the Highlands area. We obtained advice from the local Public Health officer and developed and distributed a question airc. The results were collated, analysed statistically and sent to the public Health officer for transmission to the State Health Dept. After an inordinate delay he informed us that he had to check with PG&E before he could send them. They were not sent.

We also held an open meeting at the Highlands Rec. Center and noted the possible effect on home values

We were also interviewed at length in our home by a PG&E representative who asked such ridiculous questions as "Did we really believe EMFs affect living tissues?" Of course they do. (MRI are based on it.)

They also lied to us about PCB spills in our neighbourhood. We saw one clean up.

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They have accumulated a vast amount of data on this issue and have also threatened massive counter suit in one well know case that was prepared for court. It was dropped for fear of economic reprisals.

PG&E obviously has considerable political power in the state government and its Health Department. They may prove difficult to sway,

First, let me say that our opinions and concerns are driven by more than just routine NIMBY politics. Legitimate health issues arise from a 5-fold increase in the amount of electricity being transmitted, particularly in an exclusively residential community. I know it is hard (if not impossible) to prove a negative, but further research and data is required to support the presumption that the electrical capacity increase will have insignificant health or environmental effects. Also, we wish to note an environmental justice concern that we have. The Highlands is the least well-off of all the hillside communities, and not coincidentally happens to be the one with the greatest concentration of minorities and lower-income whites. A project such as this one would not be proposed in Woodside or Hillsborough.

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
