My wife and I reside at 1968 Lexington Ave. in the San Mateo Highlands area. The west side of our home faces out on the San Francisco City & County watershed land. We have enjoyed the view of this pristine area for over 30 years. The natural, unspoiled beauty of this area was a prime factor on our decision to live here. In fact the only drawback was and is now the existing overhead power lines and towers. I had a chance to chat with you after the EIR Scoping Meeting in Daly City so I know that you are well acquainted with all the concerns of the project. With so many negatives surfacing about the project, I think it is incumbent on PG&E to act in a manner responsible to the affected communities. This is a chance for PG& E to show its concern for the public by putting the new power lines under ground. At the very least, an alternative route along the Hwy. 280 easement away from the homes should be used. This would be a win-win situation for both parties. Please give serious consideration to this and other issues at the Screening of Alternatives Meeting and other meetings during the EIR process.

If the proposed Jefferson Martin transmission line, which I understand, would primarily supply electricity for San Francisco (which may, or may not be needed) then local generation options should be explored. If reliability is one of the main goals of this project, (and it is, according to PG&E) then having local generation is much more reliable than transmission line electricity. The distance from here to San Francisco is great and it would make more sense to retrofit Hunter's Point, using the Williams agreement generators.

The proposed power lines would also have a negative impact on property value because of safety and health concerns about more EMF emissions.

Please consider having the proposed 230kV line (if it is indeed necessary to build it) put underground, away from our homes, ideally west of 280.
