COUNTY, CA. - MY FAMILY AND I HAVE BEEN RESIDENTS OF THE SAN MATEO HIGHLANDS FOR OVER 35 YEARS, AND OUR HOME IS NEAR LEXINGTON AVE. WHICH IS THAT PORTION BORDERING THE ABOVE PROPOSED TRANSMISSION LINE PROJECT. - ALONG WITH ALL THE OTHER RESIDENTS OF THE SAN MATEO HIGHLANDS RESIDENTIAL AREA, WE ARE VERY CONCERNED ABOUT THIS PROPOSAL BECAUSE OF THE POTENTIAL FOR INCREASED HEALTH RISKS FROM ELECTRICAL AND MAGNETIC FIELDS (E.M.F.) EMISSION.

WE ARE OPPOSED TO THE LOCATION OF THE [REDACTED] PROPOSED PROJECT FOR MANY PLAUSIBLE REASONS, PRIMARILY: (1) HEALTH RISKS; (2) E.M.F. EMISSION INTERFERING WITH LOCAL RESIDENTIAL HOMES EQUIPMENT TO INCLUDE COMPUTERS; (3) NEGATIVE IMPACT ON AESTHETICS FROM THE PROPOSED TALLER TOWERS, AND; (4) POTENTIALLY SIGNIFICANT NEGATIVE IMPACT ON PROPERTY VALUE FROM SAFETY AND HEALTH CONCERNS ABOUT E.M.F.

Since there is a plan in the works to upgrade this facility, I would ask that the Utility to be forced to consider **OUR** needs for a change.
