## F. PUBLIC PARTICIPATION

This section summarizes the CPUC's program of public notice and participation to maximize agency and public input for the Los Banos-Gates 500 kV Transmission Project environmental review process.

### F.1 EIR SCOPING PROCESS

The scoping process for the Los Banos-Gates 500 kV Transmission Project EIR consisted of four elements:

- (1) Publication of a Notice of Preparation (NOP) of an EIR and Notice of Public Scoping Meetings soliciting comments from affected public agencies, as required by CEQA, as well as from the public;
- (2) Public scoping meetings;
- (3) Review of scoping comments; and
- (4) Establishment of an Internet web site, electronic mail address, a telephone hotline, and local Information Repositories.

Each of these elements is described below.

### F.1.1 NOTICE OF PREPARATION

The CPUC issued the NOP on July 10, 2001 and distributed it to the State Clearinghouse and city, county, state and federal agencies, affected state and federal legislators, and local elected officials. There were approximately 200 copies of the NOP mailed out. A 30-day period for interested parties to submit comments regarding the content of the EIR ended on August 9, 2001.

### F.1.2 SCOPING MEETINGS

Two public scoping meetings were conducted as part of the EIR scoping process to receive input regarding the scope and content of this EIR, as well as alternatives and mitigation measures which should be considered. The following scoping meetings were held:

- July 24, 2001 at 1:30 pm at the Los Banos Council Chambers in Los Banos City Hall
- July 24, 2001 at 7:00 pm at the Harris Ranch on Interstate 5 in Fresno County

### F.1.3 SUMMARY OF SCOPING COMMENTS

# F.2 PUBLIC NOTIFICATION

### F.2.1 NOTIFICATION FOR SCOPING MEETINGS

This information was also posted on the CPUC's project website and announced on the recording of the project hotline.

Scoping meeting notices were published on July 18, 2001 in three newspapers in the project area: Hanford Sentinel, Fresno Bee, and Merced Sun Star.

## F.2.2 NOTICE OF RELEASE OF DRAFT EIR AND PROPERTY OWNER NOTIFICATION

A Notice of Release of the Draft Supplemental EIR will be sent to property owners and occupants on or adjacent to PG&E 's Proposed Project and the alternative routes in October 2001, including information on how to review or obtain copies of the Draft Supplemental EIR.
