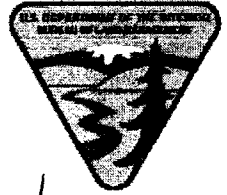



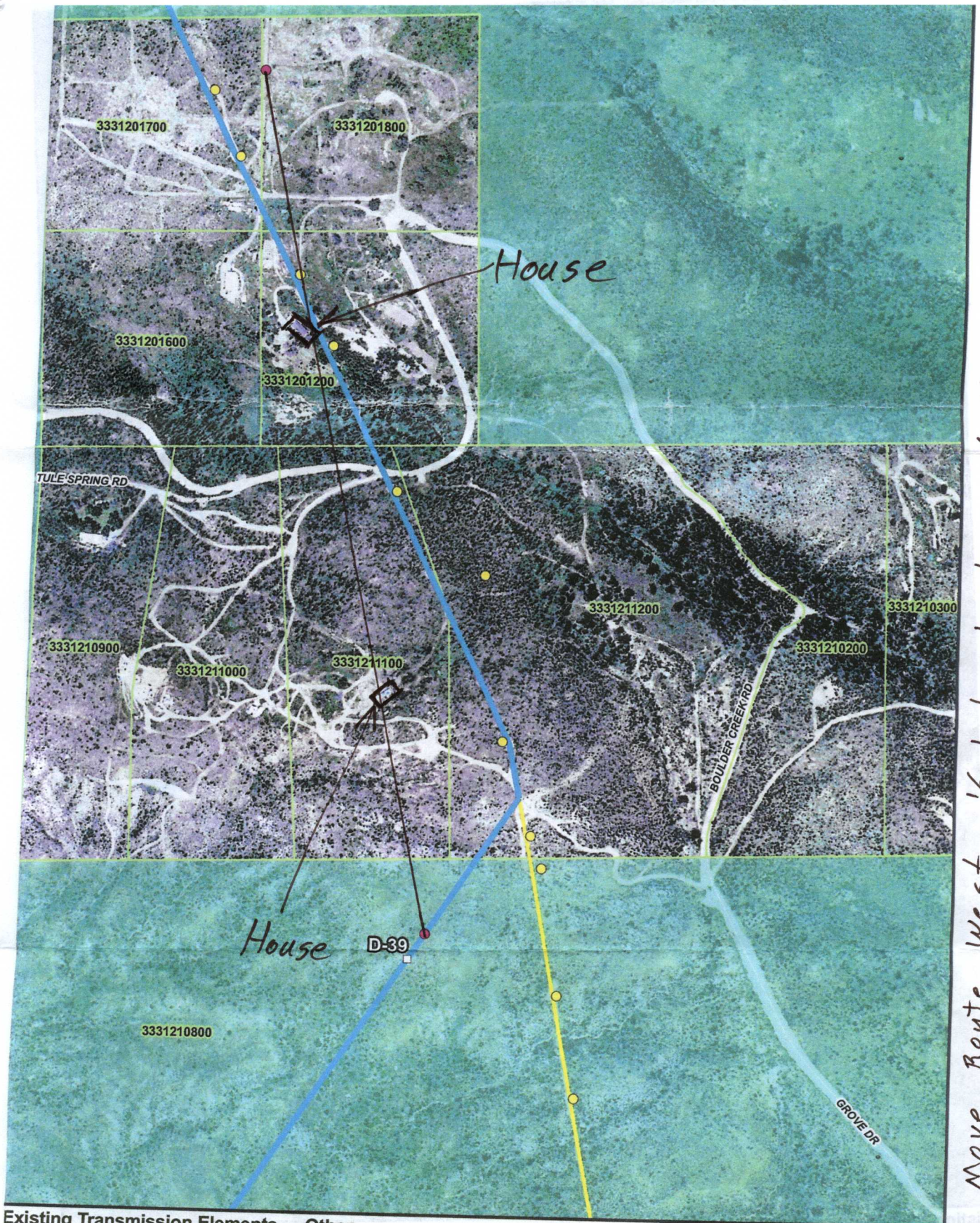

Comment: On map D-41, a line between the two red dots (towers) crosses over two occupied dwellings. There are several other dwellings or dwelling sites in the immediate area. If route D must be used, a shift to the west 1/2 to 1 mile in a straight line from D-38 to D-43 would miss the homes in the area saving the expense of buying the houses. Eliminating the "jog" in the route would also save the expense of one or two towers.

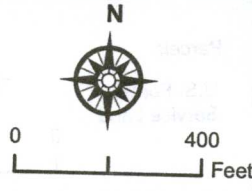

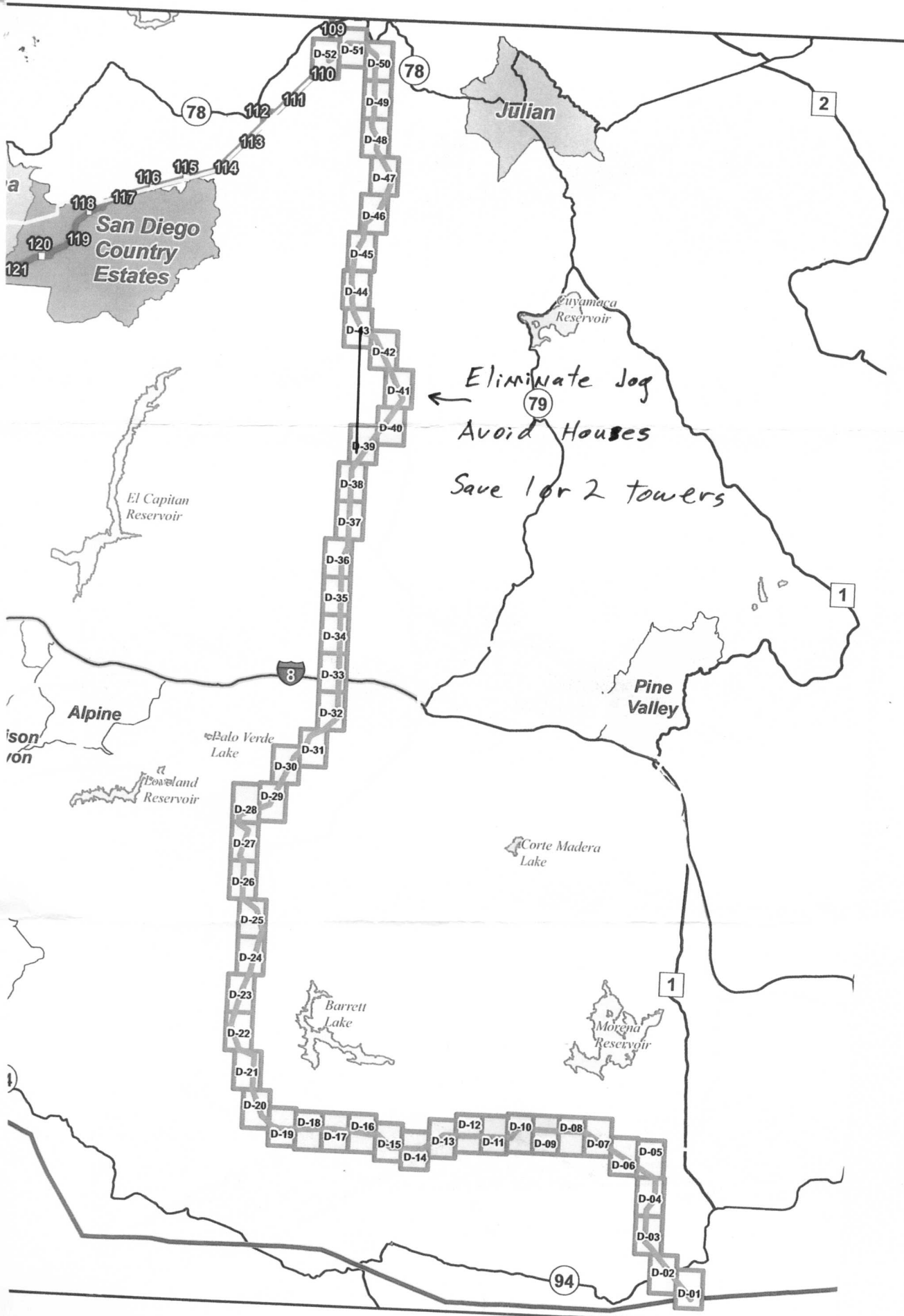
