This Alternative resolves for me, the two issues that caused my initial concern. In any case, I would prefer underground transmission lines as opposed to the unsightly steel towers. The technology exists, just ask SDG&E. Oh, by the way, SDG&E will then demand that their inspectors get inspect the underground installation that you install and pay for!
