***Subject: Minor Project Refinement Request (MPRR) #47 — Transmission Line (TL) 626 Conversion North/TL 626 Remove from Service (RFS) — Cleveland National Forest Power Line Replacement Projects (Application No. 12-10-009)***

Dear Ms. Reynolds:

On April 9, 2020, San Diego Gas & Electric (SDG&E) submitted Minor Project Refinement Request (MPRR) #47 to the California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC), to modify components of Transmission Line (TL) 626 Conversion North/TL 626 Remove from Service (RFS). In summary, SDG&E requested shifting of Pole P259353 approximately 11 feet west; shifting of the replacement pole for Pole P259354 approximately 28 feet west, as well as the addition of a new anchor, temporary pole work area, and anchor work area; shifting of the replacement pole for Pole P259355 approximately 29 feet northwest, as well as the addition of temporary pole work area; and the addition of approximately 830 feet of construction-only access road between Boulder Creek Road and the Boulder Creek Fly Yard, as described in the MPRR.

The CPUC voted on May 26, 2016 to approve the Cleveland National Forest Power Line Replacement Projects (Decision 16-05-038) and a Notice of Determination was submitted to the State Clearinghouse (SCH#2013091070).

The Commission decision approving the Permit to Construct (PTC) authorizes Energy Division staff to approve requests by SDG&E for minor project refinements. The decision states that minor project refinements that may be necessary due to final engineering of the project may be approved so long as such minor project refinements are located within the geographic boundary of the study area of the EIR/EIS and do not, without mitigation, result in a new significant impact or a substantial increase in the severity of a previously identified significant impact based on the criteria used in the EIR/EIS; conflict with any mitigation measure or applicable law or policy; or trigger an additional permit requirement.

This letter documents the CPUC's thorough evaluation of all activities covered in MPRR #47 and that the changes requested in MPRR #47 are allowed pursuant to the Commission decision issuing the PTC. In accordance with the Mitigation Monitoring, Compliance, and Reporting Program, MPRR #47 was reviewed by CPUC to confirm that no new impacts or increase in impact severity would result from the requested activities.
