Dear Ms. Reynolds:

San Diego Gas & Electric (SDG&E) has requested authorization from the California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) to conduct geotechnical activities on Circuit (C) 79A to complete the final engineering design. SDG&E is proposing to conduct 8 geotechnical borings as described in the SDG&E NTP Request #18 dated July 6, 2018.

The Power Line Replacement Projects were evaluated in accordance with the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) and a Permit to Construct (PTC) was issued by the CPUC on June 2, 2016 (Decision D. 16-05-038, dated May 26, 2016). **NTP 18 is granted by CPUC for proposed construction activities based on the following factors:**

• The Final EIR prepared for the Power Line Replacement Projects defined required mitigation measures to be implemented prior to project construction. The relevant mitigation measures for construction activities under this Notice to Proceed are summarized in *Attachment A* and shall be implemented by SDG&E and its designated contractor. SDG&E's compliance with the preconstruction component for each measure is noted in the status table.

The conditions noted below shall be met by SDG&E for NTP 18:

• Documentation of a Right of Entry from California State Parks shall be provided to CPUC prior to proceeding with boring locations on California State Parks land.
