The California Public Utilities Commission's (Commission) Energy Division has conducted and completed its review of Southern California Edison's (SCE) Application for Modification Permit to Construct (PTC) and the Proponent's Environmental Assessment (PEA) for the Eagle Mountain-Blythe 161kV, Subtransmission Line Project filed on July 21, 2024. After reviewing SCE's materials, the Energy Division is deeming SCE's application complete as of today.

Please note that the Energy Division may request additional data as we move forward with preparation of the environmental document. In order to expedite our efforts, we request that SCE make its technical staff and environmental consultants available to Energy Division staff who will be conducting the environmental review for the SCE application. Commission staff may require such consultations for the purpose of obtaining further data and information, and other necessary tasks to complete environmental review in compliance with the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA).
