²The number of waterbodies was determined using the United States (U.S.) Geological Survey's National Hydrography Dataset and review of aerial imagery. Waterbodies include any drainage feature that is potentially under the jurisdiction of the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers or the California Department of Fish and Wildlife.

³The number of wetlands was determined using U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service's (USFWS's) National Wetlands Inventory geospatial data.
