## 11.0 GLOSSARY OF TERMS AND ACRONYMS

A glossary of terms and acronyms used in this document is included below, in alphabetical order. In some cases, the meaning of a term as used in this document may be specific to Metromedia's proposed project and may not coincide with the meaning intended in other contexts. For these terms, an effort has been made in this glossary to indicate alternative definitions that may be used elsewhere.

## 11.1 GLOSSARY OF TERMS

Backbone	In general terms, a backbone is the fiber optic cable that is the framework for the network. For the San Francisco Bay Area Network, the Backbone would be comprised of the route segments that follow the Caltrain line in San Francisco and the South Bay and the Union Pacific railroad line in the East Bay.
Cable	A bundle of glass optical fibers wrapped in thin plastic sheathing; cables come in a range of diameters depending on the number of fibers they contain. A smaller cable may contain 144 fibers; a larger cable, such as one containing 864 fibers, is known as a "trunk."
Criteria Air Pollutants	Pollutants that are pervasive in urban environments and for which health- based state or national ambient air quality standards have been established.
Handhole	A handhole is a point of access to underground fiber optic cable. It may also be referred to as a "utility access vault."
Manhole	A manhole is a point of access to underground fiber optic cable. It may also be referred to as a "utility access vault."
Innerduct	A duct or conduit placed inside a larger conduit.
Loop	Route segments serving an area adjacent to the network backbone. Loops connect to the backbone.
Local exchange carrier facility	A facility into which fiber optic cable terminate to access a telephone company's subscribers who are within the facility's service area. Also known as a Central Office.
Metromedia	Fiber optic communications company, the applicant for this proposed project.
Network	A system of fiber optic cable that carries communication signals between different locations. A smaller network might carry communications among employees within one business, while a larger network, such as the networks Metromedia is proposing for the San Francisco and Los Angeles metropolitan areas, would carry communications among numerous different users located in many communities.
Photosimulation	The creation of an image of what a project would look like if built, usually using a computerized digital process to superimpose a scaled image of the project onto an image of the proposed site.

Segment	The San Francisco Bay Area and the Los Angeles Basin networks are divided into smaller segments. The San Francisco Bay Area is broken up into 10 segments and the Los Angeles Basin Network consists of 18 segments.
Spread	A term indicating a combination of personnel (crew) and equipment that is needed to accomplish a task or part of a task.
Staging Area	An area where equipment and supplies needed for a task or set of tasks are stored.
Toxic Air Contaminants	Pollutants that occur at relatively low concentrations and are associated with carcinogenic and other adverse health effects, but for which no ambient air quality standards have been established.
Trunk	A large fiber optic cable that contains a greater number of fibers than a cable, such as 864 fibers.
